Junior Literacy: continued focus on "Acadience"

- Cross-Panel Pathway: ongoing work to support grade 8 students progression to grade 9
- School Spirit and Assemblies: "Marvellous Mustangs"
 multi-theme Assemblies recognizing and honouring our
 school values and achievements, where educators as
 well as students will get to vote on the value being
 honoured. With Ribbons and Certificates to celebrate
 achievements. With plans to do a split assembly with
 grades K-3 first, and grades 4-8 second.
- Health and Well-Being: Health Action Team; focus on healthy relationships, positive school culture and physical activity. Working with the Healthy Schools CYCP to register for the Healthy School certifaction. The purpose is to promote health in general. Such things will be tracked and promoted with Bronze, Silver and Gold and will be teacher and student-driven
- Traffic and Safety: ongoing concerns regarding "no stopping/no parking" zones on Airport Rd during drop off and pick up times. With upcoming construction, there are plans to extend a pathway for walking and biking through the back field and encourage families to use alternate entry ways to the school property
- Extracurricular Activities:

- Book Fair: Meet the teacher night was a great success with pizza and funnel cake truck and Scholastics Book Fair raising over \$2,000, which will be put back into the library for new books and resources
- Parent Engagement: upcoming series of literacy sessions to support families at home K-3 learning to read. Supporting programs include: Acadience, and UFLI
- Umbrella Child Care: program running smoothly with

Chairs Report

Fundraising: Discussion on chocolate fundraising options that are easy and accommodating to families to manage with upfront costs as well as supplier options, and types of chocolate (nut-free, kosher, and dietary concerns considered). Suggested sale price per bars or \$90 per box with the option of returning unsold bars to ensure no extra cost is incurred by families who would like to participate. Proceeds to be directed toward student enrichment, such as technology, sports, or classroom needs.

Discussion held regarding "Fundscrip" gift card fundraiser for the holiday season. This Program allows families to purchase retail gift cards, with a percentage of each sale donated back to the school. Available in both physical and electronic cards. Council discussed promoting the program before Christmas and revisiting it again before Easter. Option for funds to be directed toward student achievement needs such as tech upgrades, jerseys, or equipment.

Fund Allocation Discussion: ideas for how raised funds could best support the school include *new jerseys* for sports teams, updated classroom technology, physical education and recess equipment, and student achievement and well-being programs
