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#### From the Principal's Desk...

Report cards go home and February 13<sup>th</sup>. Please review your child's comments carefully as they will contain important next steps to help your child set goals. As always, please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns.

Reading is important for progress in all subjects in school. If you would like to discuss what your child is reading, you could use the following prompts:

Start with a book talk. Look at the front cover. What is the title? Look at the picture on the cover. Who wrote the book? Discuss the picture; is it an illustration or a photo? This is a pre reading strategy. Is this book fiction or non-fiction and how do you know?

Read the first 1-2 pages. Think about the cover, the title and what you have read so far. What do you think is going to happen in this story?

Read the rest of the story and stop often. Talk about the story before, during and after reading. Try to relate it to something in your life. (What connections can you make? Text to text, text to self, text to world)

### In order to have your child think deeper about what they are reading ask:

- If the author changed the time or place of the story, how would the story change?
- Do any characters learn a lesson in this story? Explain how the character learns this lesson.
- Tell one lesson the author might want us to learn from this story. How could you use this lesson in your own life?
- Which is your favourite character? Why? How are you similar to/different from this character?
- If you could ask a character in the story three questions, what would they be? What do you think the answers would be? What would happen next if the story kept going? Write a new chapter to the story.
