## WELCOME

- Land Acknowledgement
- Introductions around the room
- Approval of September Council meeting minutes: All in favour, with spelling corrections.
- Ashlea Marquez is to be added to the email list.
- Approval of meeting agenda: All in favour.
- Carolyn Reid volunteered to be Council secretary. All in favour.


## HOME AND SCHOOL REPORT: Ashlea Marquez

- Pumpkin stroll is leading up to be a success; 51 pumpkins have been sold so far.
- Home and School has received good feedback and has been asked to host more events for the community.
- Funds raised will be used to cover permitting and rental fees for future events.
- AGM is coming up; contact Home and School for more information.
- Next Norwood Home and School meeting is November $14^{\text {th }}$ at 7 pm .
- Upcoming fundraiser is through FundScrip; gift cards for common retail locations. $100 \%$ of the purchased value goes on the card, retailers will donate a percentage of the amount back to the program. Starts in November.


## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT: Rhonda Moules

- Construction update: The lift to the stage is complete. All other construction is complete and they are finishing up deficiencies.
- Terry Fox and cross country were successful events.
- Junior swim had a huge turnout; more Norwood students attended than the other schools combined.
- Junior volleyball is ongoing.
- PA day focused on anti-black racism, bias in the workplace, math curriculum, and Knowledgehook.
- Grade 8 Commencement will be on June $25^{\text {th }}$. Marquis Gardens is booked. Waiting for Hill Park permit to come through.
- Grade 7 s and 8 s are allowed to leave for second break. Concerns around students coming back to school on time, safety when out in the community, and equity for all students.
- Discussion held re. whether leaving at break should only be allowed on Fridays; this must be up to the individual parents. Many life-lessons around responsibility, communication, problem solving, street smarts, independence, confidence, highschool preparedness, etc.
- Run on a strike basis? If a student is late more than once, they aren't allowed to leave again?
- HSR has warned the schools of a potential strike; 63 Norwood students would be affected if the busses aren't running. Students would not be penalized if they were late arriving at school because of a transportation delay or strike.
- Grade 8 overnight trip probably won’t take place; instead, an extended daytrip will be planned, like last year.
- Official school fundraising plan is due to the Board Superintendent by the end of October; can be finalized until the end of November and tweaks can be made throughout the year.
- Julia Hayes is officially Norwood Park's permanent Vice Principal; congratulations Mme. Hayes!


## FUNDRAISING: Shannon-Leigh Chandler

- Discussion around possible fundraisers: Poinsettias and Muskoka Coffee were offered.
- Overall interest in the Big Box of Cards fundraiser: Various options for mixed occasion cards and Holiday cards. Profit is around \$11 per box sold. Shannon-Leigh will ask Stevie if this is still an option for this year.
- Teacher wishes include team jerseys and/or other identifying wearables; school has low stock because students borrow them for events and they are frequently not returned to the school.


## CHAIR'S REPORT: Shannon-Leigh Chandler

- Pizza Pizza lunch meets all Board criteria; profit is $\$ 6$ per cheese pizza and $\$ 5$ per pepperoni pizza.
- Concern raised around cold pizza being served to the students who go outside at the start of break; rotating the serving schedule poses challenges around supervision and is most likely not possible.
- Request for volunteers was made; Ruby, Kim and Lisa will help Shannon-Leigh
- Lemon and Ice is our new lunch option. Concern raised that some of the ingredients are not nut-free; Shannon-Leigh will verify with the company.
- Council Chairs attended the annual Board meeting re. School Council start up. Funds given to us by the Board go toward running childcare during School Council meeting times.
- Lisa is building an equity spreadsheet to inform families on where to share/find information.
- Discussion held around hosting a volunteer meeting to discuss the volunteer sign up processes, examples of when volunteers are needed, guide families through their police check, etc. When to hold the meeting; before or after school? Before the next School Council meeting?


## SPIRIT WEAR: Shannon-Leigh Chandler

- Suggestion made for used-spirit wear sale, possibly at French Café.
- New spirit wear sale in time for the Holidays? Possibly only if we use the same company and no design changes are needed.
- Concerns around the sizes last year, especially the neck opening; are there options for different fits?
- This year's spirit wear logo to be Norwood, not Panthers.
- Shannon-Leigh to follow up with the company we used last year.


## SUBCOMMITTEES AND SPECIAL EVENTS

- French Café: General interest in running this event again this year.
- Holiday Lunch: December is too soon. Consider for after January when prices will be lower and caterers would be more available. Possibly around Carnival? Considerations around equity, allergies, etc. to be considered.
- French Café and Holiday Lunch can only take place if someone volunteers to head the subcommittees, and enough volunteers agree to organize and support the event.


## NEW BUSINESS

- Discussion held around nutrition-free food days, including Halloween parties; teachers make up groups so the students will bring in a variety of foods. Is this allergy-safe?
- Rhonda to clarify, to all families, that bringing in food for these occasions is allowed.


## ACTION ITEMS:

- Shannon-Leigh to discuss Big Box of Cards fundraiser with Stevie.
- Notice in newsletter for everyone to return their team jerseys.
- Sign out sheet for team jerseys?
- Shannon-Leigh to verify that all Lemon and Ice ingredients are nut-free.
- Rhonda to clarify, to all families, that bringing in food for planned classroom events (eg. Halloween party) is allowed.
- Shannon-Leigh to follow-up re. spirit wear.
