Principal Report:	Public Health nurse sent out survey to students in grade 5 and 6 to see how they are feeling about the school climate. Most people are not experiencing too many negative feelings. Discussion about cleanliness is the current topic.	M. Panju/ M. Lutterotti
	Mr Lutterotti has been including a social script to the announcements each morning. These are to inforce and acknowledge the expectation of positive behaviour in the school. These scripts remind and teach students of the behaviours that we may assume students have already learned in a way that focuses on the positive and reinforces or introduces ways to handles social situations with repetition.	
	Recess guardians are being recruited and trained to organize and play games for younger students during recess.	
	There was a successful PA Day for teachers with a strong instructional focus. Teachers have been designing team projects and have had the chance to monitor and report on progress. They used this day to focus only on positive and left negative behavioural

New Business	Cuest Speaker Megan from

	orchestra joined us via teams	
	to talk about their adopt a	
	school program. We were the	
	chosen school based on our	
	application which included	
	great recommendation	
	letters, and the way we	
	described how this program	
	would be implemented in our	
	school as well as being a high	
	priority school that has never	
	been chosen for this program	
	before. The program offers	
	exposure of orchestral	
	instruments to students who	
	may not normally have	
	access to these types of	
	instruments. There are 7	
	modules that will be	
	implemented throughout the	
	school year. Students have	
	begun to be introduced to 4	

professionals who will share their stories of how they came to play their specific instruments with the students. Grades 1-6 will get to see a concert performed at the school on Nov 1st. Another module will teach grade 4 students to tell stories with their music and composition. Grade 6 students will learn how to become an active listener of music and be able to recognize different sounds. There will also be 65 complimentary tickets given to families of the school community to see a HPO performance. Nearing the end of the school year and this program the musicians will come and coach the students during a rehearsal and will have an opportunity to play together with the pro. (potentially the 4 who shared their stories at the start of the program).
