- ii. So, students aren't bystanders, we have an action sequence by acronym STOP (Speak Up Tell what's wrong Offer help Protect by reporting)
- iii. From kindergarten we are promoting the inclusion of all peoples

- Early Reading Data
 - i. Mandatory Ministry Kindergarten-gr. 2 Screening for Reading
 - ii. School-wide screening all the way to grade 8
 - iii. We've found:
 - 1. All grade 4-6 students were administered the Acadience MAZE assessment for reading comprehension
 - a. "It is a passage given to students where every so often a word is missing, and the student must choose one of three words to put in that makes sense in the story.
 - 2. From data:
 - a. 23 of 125 scored as approaching grade level in grades 4-6
 - b. Intermediate (grade 7 & 8)
 - i. 3 passages (fiction, social studies, science), 3 mins per passage
 - ii. Maze: Only 12% scored above grade level
 - iii. Silent Reading:
 - 1. Silent Reading 40% scored at or above
 - 2. 22% scored below grade
 - 3. 38% scored well below grade level
 - c. SK (letter naming and first sounds) encouraging results 64% at or above grade level

- d. Grade 1 (Letter Naming Fluency, Phoneme Segmentation Fluency, Nonsense Word Fluency)- 14% At or above grade level
- e. Grade 2 (Nonsense Word Fluency, Oral Reading Fluency)-41% At or above grade level
- f. EQAO assessment completed using iPad
 - i. Grade 3's underperforming relative to Board in Reading, Writing and Math
 - ii. Grade 6's relatively on par with Board data.
- iv. Plan of Support
 - 1. Appreciate parents engagement in School Council
 - a. Whole group lessons for comprehension
 - b. Read alouds with reading responses, written and oral
 - c. Targeted guided instruction
 - d. Lexia Reading Intervention for students in Grades 2-5
 - e. Itinerant support (Reading Specialist, Learning Resource Teachers (Empower), Curriculum Consultants)
