

 We have purchased some new books for the library that embrace characters with Autism.


 Students participated in a creative competition by creating a poster that celebrates the diversity of all minds.

Committee members' terms will be one school year. EQAO is currently seeking applications from students interested in joining the committee for the 2025-2026 school year.

# How do I apply?

- □ Step 1: Discuss your interest in serving on this committee with your parent or guardian, and your school principal or vice-principal. If you are selected to be on the committee, we will require written permission from your parent or guardian, and support from your principal.
- ☐ Step 2: Please complete the application form found at https://forms.gle/yKAHaxEPtxjWD8VZ6
- ☐ You may submit your personal narrative in writing (250-350 words) or in video format (3-5 minutes).

#### When will I know if I have been selected?
