Hello Everyone,

Thank you for your continued support as our school grows and adapts! Your partnership has been especially meaningful as we navigated reorganizations to better support students. Your patience and positivity through all the recent changes have made a big difference.

We're incredibly proud of how smoothly our students have settled into their daily routines this fall. As a reminder, our school day begins promptly at **8:30 AM**, with supervision available from **8:15 to 8:30 AM**. To support a calm and focused start to the day, we ask that all students arrive on time and ready to learn. Students arriving after 8:30 must check in at the office. For the safety and well-being of everyone, we kindly ask that parents and visitors only enter the school during the day if arrangements have been made in advance with staff. Additionally, we ask that there be **no student pickups after 2:30 PM**. The office will not be able to call students down to the office right before dismissal. If you need to pick up your child, please do so at the regular dismissal time of **2:50 PM**. Thank you for your continued support in helping us maintain a safe, respectful, and welcoming school environment.

On **Friday, November 7th**, we will be having Electrical Safety Assemblies in the gym. This is both an informative and entertaining presentation done by Hydro One to make children aware of the dangers of electricity and learn how to avoid harm or injuries to themselves. Each assembly is geared towards a specific age group. There will be an assembly just for kindergarten at 8:45am, then Grades 1 to 3 will go at 11:00, then the 4 to 8's will have their assembly at 1:50
