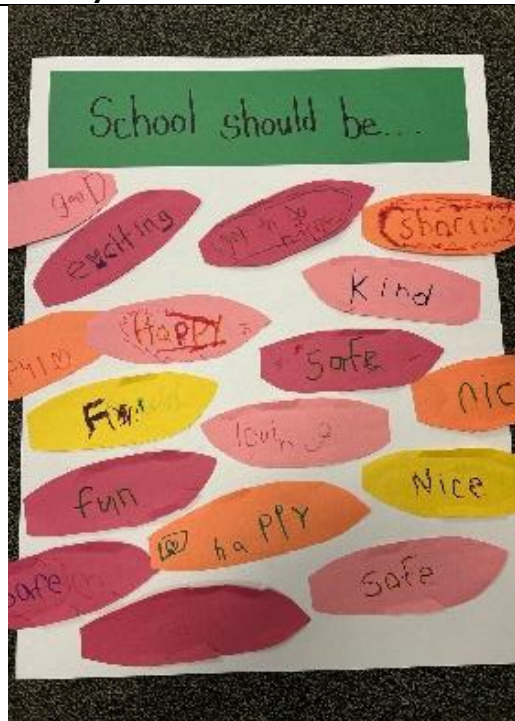

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation- Orange Shirt Day



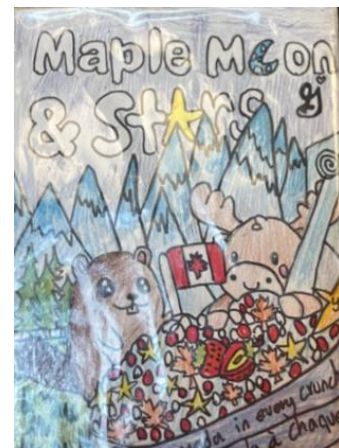
Orange Shirt Day, recognized on September 30, is a time to honour Indigenous children who were sent to residential schools and to acknowledge the lasting impact these institutions had on families and communities. At QV, many staff and students wore orange to show our commitment to truth, reconciliation, and creating a safe, inclusive environment for all. Students and staff took part in meaningful conversations and learning throughout the day.

Learning from Ms. Dykstra's class:

In Kindergarten, students read the book Phyllis's Orange Shirt. When Phyllis was a little girl, she was excited to go to residential school for the first time. Her Granny bought her a bright orange shirt that she loved, and she wore it to school for her first day. When she arrived at school her bright orange shirt was taken away. This is both Phyllis Webstad's true story and the story behind Orange Shirt Day which is a day for us all to reflect upon the treatment of First Nations people and the message that 'Every Child Matters'. Students made connections by brainstorming ideas of how they would like their school experience to be.

Learning from Ms. Taylor's class:

Over the past couple weeks, 78A students have been learning about Canadian identity and history, and in particular treaties, The Indian Act, and residential schools. In addition, they have been learning about healthy eating and advertising techniques (media literacy). In art we have been learning about the elements in art, particularly line, shape, texture, and space. Students have used inquiry and their creativity to create a Canadian-themed cereal to "be released" on Truth and Reconciliation Day that will educate the public about our Indigenous heritage.


Dear Students:
