Elementary Learning: Human Development & Sexual Health

The Ministry of Education has introduced a revised Ontario Curriculum: Health and Physical Education Grades 1-8, (2019) to replace the interim 2018 document. There is also a new Program/Policy Memorandum 162: Exemption from Instruction related to the Human Development and Sexual Health Expectations, Grades 1–8, (2019) to accompany the updated curriculum document. This memorandum outlines the process for communicating with families about Strand D: Growth and Development and Sexual Health and the process for parents/guardians to exempt their child(ren) from this learning.

HWDSB is informing elementary parents/guardians that learning on Strand D: Growth and Development and Sexual Health will occur between May 3 and June 20, 2021. Here is what families can expect as we approach these dates:

A board-wide Parent Information Night via Teams Live (in lieu of school sessions) will be held on **Wednesday**, **April 21**, **2021 from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m**. Details about this session will be communicated soon.

An exemption form will need to completed if parents/guardians want their child(ren) exempted from this learning. The form is now available and can be accessed through Parent Portal. Paper copies and/or phone calls to schools will also be accepted if Parent Portal is not an option.

Teachers will send individual letters regarding classroom activities and learning to parents/guardians in May.

For additional information ahead of these events, parents/guardians can view HWDSB's Health and Physical Education Parent Guide and the Ministry of Education curriculum document below. We have also included the Human Development and Sexual Health Expectations for Grades 1-8 to give families a better understanding of the material that will be taught at each level.

Bell Time Changes

As you may be aware, Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation Services (HWSTS) is the student transportation consortium established between the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board (HWDSB) and the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board (HWCDSB) to administer transportation services for both boards to eligible students residing in the City of Hamilton.

Over the past three years, the current school bus driver shortage has resulted in daily late pickups and drop-offs for approximately 25 to 35 routes, which impacts students' time learning in school.


In December 2019, both school boards approved the parameters of a School Bell Time Study. The study looked at all school bell times across the district in both Boards, with the possibility of adjusting school bell times to make the routes more efficient and reduce the number of buses on the road.

Class 3FC - Creative Coding with Scratch: The students in class F3C have been exploring coding in creative ways while using the program Scratch. Students have worked to code and develop multi-level games, stories that include movement and dialogue, multi-step dance routines and much more. Aren has applied his skills to create a MS Teams simulator. It is interactive and mimics the call screen that students interact with during our class meetings.

As our class navigates through the various strands of math, we come back to Scratch on a weekly basis during our Scratch Showcase. Students present ideas and provide guidance to one another about how to code for different events and outcomes.
