



## Virtual Learning Dos and Don'ts

Do's	Don'ts
<b>Choose Board standard tools for professional responsibilities</b> MS Teams for EDU and The HUB are secure and supported by the HWDSB IIT Division. Staff already using a different platform can continue through the closure period.	<b>Avoid non-HWDSB standard platforms for professional responsibilities</b> Some platforms pose privacy and security concerns and may share student data with a 3 <sup>rd</sup> party—It is safer to use Teams and The HUB.
<b>Use the tools within the platforms to communicate with colleagues, learners and parents/caregivers</b> Both platforms have tools for communication that are board-supported and are housed within the HWDSB network.	<b>Don't use personal emails or text with learners and parents</b> Using a personal text or email erodes personal/professional boundaries.
<b>Prepare for learning</b> Prior to starting: Test the audio; Find a quiet space to video meet; Use the blur background feature in Teams if it's a video meeting; Dress appropriately; Mute other technology; Keep focus on one meeting at a time; and, ensure you've ended the video and audio when you are done.	<b>Don't ignore professional advice</b> Review <a href="#">OCT Professional Advisory: Maintaining Professionalism-Use of Electronic Communication and Social Media</a> , <a href="#">OCT Ethical Standard</a> & <a href="#">OCT Standard Of Practice</a>
<b>Maintain professional standards</b> The virtual classroom has the same expectations as the physical classroom. The educator sets the tone and models expectations.	<b>Don't ignore or relax the educator-student boundaries</b> Please be sure to convey professionalism. Parents and other family members also have access to the classroom.
<b>Communicate expectations</b> Remind the learners that the expectations of the virtual classroom are the same as the physical classroom.	<b>Don't ignore classroom management</b> Classroom management may look different but is still vital in a virtual learning space. Having no established norms and expectations will result in less effective learning.
<b>Support learners to develop digital citizenship</b> Make all learners aware that they are not to screen capture anyone's image or record a class in any way without their teacher's permission and their classmates' consent.	<b>Don't accept behaviour on-line that is not acceptable in person</b> Consider reviewing your class meeting norms or co-create a digital learning contract. Learners may not understand the difference between a physical and virtual space.
<b>Consider providing asynchronous activities</b> Provide flexible due-dates and consider recording your lesson to allow learners to access it when they can.	<b>Don't penalize learners for not "attending" a lesson.</b> Not all students can access virtual learning at the same time.
<b>Pre-record a lesson in Teams and post to Teams or The HUB.</b> Pre-recording and posting a lesson makes it available to the whole class at any time and provides access to all learners.	<b>Don't record a live lesson or class without consent</b> Teams alerts everyone that a session is being recorded. The HWDSB Media Consent needs to be in place for recording to occur.
<b>Make learners aware of the available accessibility features</b> During Teams Meetings, prompt users to enable Live Captions, and draw their attention to the built in Translate and Immersive Reader features in the chat.	<b>Don't assume "one size fits all" with virtual learning</b> Learners who learn best with supports in-class will continue to benefit from supports online. Connect with the school resource team for support around accommodations and modifications, or for suggestions on assistive technology
<b>Share platform features for learners working on a variety of devices</b> Consider demonstrating on iPad and Desktop, or provide instructions for tablet versions and desktop versions.	<b>Don't assume that the learners all have the same access to the device that you do</b> Take advantage of platform specific walkthroughs on features to get comfortable with tablet and desktop versions at <a href="https://bit.ly/teamhwdsb">https://bit.ly/teamhwdsb</a>
