PIZZA, SMOOTHIES AND NUTRITION PROGRAMS

Pizza Days will continue on Fridays beginning October 19th. Smoothie Days will be held on Wednesdays starting on October 17th. Orders for these can be placed online for the month of October until October 10th. November and December are also available for purchase at this time if you wish to do multiple months at once.

Our Hungry Hawks Shop will be open every Tuesday during first nutrition break where popcorn, baked Lays Chips, cookies and milk will be sold. These items are all \$1.00. Frozen yogurt is also available at a cost of \$2.00.

We are aiming to have our Taste Buds Nutrition Program up and running for students who need an extra healthy snack during the day (e.g., fruit, veggies, yogurt, cheese, crackers) on Mondays and Thursdays. We are aiming to have this started the week of October 15th.

R.L. Hyslop also has special exemption nutrition days scheduled during the school year. Your child's teacher will notify you of these dates if necessary. Our school is allotted one nutrition exemption day per month. With this in mind, we ask that you please do not send food items when celebrating your child's birthday or other special events. October 31st is our next exception day. We encourage healthy snacks. *All food items must be peanut/nut free.*

VOLUNTEERS MUST HAVE POLICE CHECK: VULNERABLE SECTOR SCREENING

Part of the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board's Volunteer Policy is that all volunteers working with children must have obtained a Vulnerable Sector Screening Report. This is essentially a criminal record check and is put in place to protect our children. To obtain such a report, application forms are available at the Police

Station or on-line. Complete the form and submit either in person at the Hamilton Police Services Headquarters on King William Street in Hamilton or on-line. There is a cost for the check and it is valid for 3 years with the HWDSB. Returning volunteers must also sign an offence declaration each year. Please contact the school office for more information.
