## Daily Attendance Reminders

If your child is going to be absent, needs to be



picked up early or will be coming into school late,

please make sure to record that information in Safe Arrival. There are multiple ways families can access Safe Arrival.

Planned absences can be put in as far in advance as you are able. Same day absences, however, need to be put in the system by 10 a.m. for the system to pick them up. Please note, while office and school staff do our best to call down children for early pick up, at times this can take some time for the student to actually arrive at the front door. Please also

note that early pick ups result in the disruption of learning to your child and to the other students in the class, particularly the 3:15 to 3:35 pick-ups.

#### School Cash Online

With School Cash Online, you can pay all your child's school fees with the click of a



button, wherever, whenever. Trips to the school to drop off cash or sending your child with money will be a thing of the past. School Cash Online also enables you to keep track of your child's school items and activities.

It's easy to register, add your children, make payments, check current balance/account history, print or view receipts, and receive notifications about upcoming events. Once you sign up for an account and connect the student(s) they will be paying for, the account will move with the student(s) as they progress to other HWDSB schools.
