 - Positive School Culture: Continuation of monthly character assemblies, character trait focus, student council initiatives.
 - **Indigenous Perspectives & Well-Being:** Ongoing work incorporated into programming.

Proposed Allocation of Funds (Discussion Items)

The Fundraising Subcommittee identified several priority areas where raised funds could be allocated throughout the 2025–26 school year. These recommendations are presented for Council discussion and approval.

Potential Funding Priorities

- School Club Items
 - Support materials, supplies, and resources needed for various student clubs.
- Turf for the Gaga Pit
 - Installation of proper turf to improve safety and usability.
- Music & Arts Support
 - Funding for equipment, instruments, art supplies, and program enhancements.
- Trip Subsidies & Transportation
 - Financial support to reduce field trip costs and assist with bus transportation.
- DPA (Daily Physical Activity) Bags
 - Supplies to support student participation in daily physical activity programs.
- Grade 8 Graduation
 - Contributions toward year-end celebration, awards, and related expenses.
- Music Bags
 - Classroom-specific supplies to support music instruction.
- Natural Playground
 - Continued improvements to outdoor learning and play spaces.
- Volleyball Nets & Poles
 - Replacement or purchase of equipment needed for school sports.
- Turkey Skate
 - Funding to support this school-wide seasonal activity.
- Chromebooks & Technology
 - Investment in technology to support classroom learning and student access.
- Multi Sport Post (for playground)

Decision

School Cash Online - Ongoing Donation Postings

- Council reviewed whether to continue offering the two open, ongoing donation options on School Cash Online:
 - 1. Nutrition/Snack Program (Mondays & Fridays)
 - Last year, approximately \$1,200 in donations was received to help support the snack program.
 - 2. Trip Subsidies
 - Last year, this option generated approximately \$1,000 in contributions to help reduce the cost of field trips for families in need.
- Council discussed the value of keeping these donation options available throughout the year, as they provide consistent support for programs that directly benefit students.
