Operating Procedures

Our shared values Respect, Responsibility, and Kindness

The following practices will be in effect as of March 28th and will be monitored for effectiveness:

Morning Entry – students can play on the blacktop only. Students are not allowed on the Creative playground unless supervised by a parent/guardian—this is city property. At the bell they go to their current class lines. First period Educators will greet classes and escort them into class.

Lockers – Educators will determine whether to use small groups to control the flow or to have the whole class at lockers at one time. Educators are responsible for supervising the hall while students are at lockers/hooks.

Lunch Dismissal – Educators continue to dismiss one class at a time. If any stragglers remain please advise the office so a final sweep can be done to ensure all students are outside (or at their designated activity).

Playground Access – For our Grade 1 -3 students we will designate an area on the front portion of the playground for their use if they feel more comfortable in this zone. They may go outside this zone when they feel comfortable to do so. Recess Dismissal – At the bell, supervising staff direct classes to line up close to the appropriate entrance. We will continue to use the 2 doors for entry.

Dismissal – Period 6 Educators escort classes to their dismissal lines outside where students wait to be picked up by a parent/caregiver. If a child has permission to walk home we must have written permission from the custodial parent. Students are to leave the playground at the end of day. Supervision ends at 2:55pm, there is no playground playing during this time —if they chose to return after 2:55 pm under the responsibility of their parents they may do so.

Hand hygiene – Continue to practice good hand hygiene upon entry to a classroom, ahead of eating and following washroom use. Hand sanitizer continues to be available, along with soap and water.

Building access (pick up/drop off) – Continue to have parents/caregivers ring the doorbell upon arrival when picking up early or dropping off students throughout the day. Students will be called from class and can meet parents/caregivers at the front doors. Please limit this to exceptional circumstances only as it is disruptive to the learning of all students and disrupts the instructional day.

STREET AND BUSES SAFETY REMINDERS

When the buses arrive at the beginning and end of the day it is extremely busy outside of the school. There is no parking at the front of the school and there is a designated bus loading area. Please park on the road and come into the school to pick up your child. Children are not permitted to walk across the street unaccompanied, as it is usually extremely busy before and after school. (Some exceptions do apply for medical situations).



As we look ahead to the Spring and warmer weather, please note the following dates for the **EQAO Primary and Junior Assessments**. These assessments, for Grade Three and Grade Six students, will be administered from June 6th - June 10th, 2022.

Here are some suggestions that you might find helpful in supporting your child's learning in Mathematics at home.

PRIMARY

Include your child in everyday activities that involve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Play games and do puzzles that require reasoning.

Solve problems with your child and talk about the different steps in the solution.

Have your child show you how he or she can solve problems in different ways (e.g., through sketches, charts, graphs, words, tallies).

Let your child know that everyone can learn mathematics.

JUNIOR

Have your child help you solve everyday problems that require different operations and formulas to solve them. Play games with several steps.

Ask your child to describe a problem and explain what additional information is needed to reach a solution. Have your child show you the steps he or she has used to solve different problems.
