1. Welcome & Introduction:

Kim S. and Mr. Gris welcomed all to the meeting.

2. Approval of Last Month's Minutes:

Approval of last month's minutes (November 2015) was *motioned* by Gint M. and *seconded* by Danielle C.

3. Call for Other Business:

No other items added at this time.

4. Reports:

Student Report - Brady

- This month's pay it forward initiative is having students write a letter to a person who would appreciate it such as a refugee; senior citizen; veteran; etc. It is up to the individual students to decide who they want to write their letter to.
- The spirit day for January is Pajama Day and will take place on January 28th.

Principal Report – Mr. Gris:

- The principal's report is attached to these minutes.
- Highlights:
 - o School website - checkers page and Rousseau musical pages added.
 - o Mr. Gris walked through a summary of School Council Purchases from October 2015 through January 2016 – see agenda item 8.
 - o Lego robotics program will happen. Possibly a team of 10 students. Mr. Gris also looking into a Lego club. Possibility of families that may want to donate Lego that they are no longer using
 - o Principal Direction for Rousseau:
 - o Teachers discussed at the January staff meeting with a focus on literacy and numeracy; will continue discussions at future meetings.
 - o Mrs. Raymond discussed the tools that teachers need to do their assessments. Teachers feel supported.
 - o Rousseau recently received 3 tech tubs; staff are being trained in how to use those apps efficiently with the students. Tech tubs are for Grade 4 teachers. All students have access to technology at Rousseau.
 - o Mission statement from board. Principals got together to provide input to the board. School councils will also have the opportunity to provide input. Board staff has joined into staff meetings.
 - o Extra-curricular: Brady said kids were really excited about floor hockey; European hand ball introduced for younger grades. Teams could be based on experience instead of unexperienced. Parents at the council meeting suggested that younger grades would rather play floor hockey given

- the experience these children already have in playing ice hockey.
- o Peter Pan takes place on February 2nd. There are limited tickets (100) for Junior end. ELP2 is also going. Goldirocks will be available for students that aren't able to go to Peter Pan.
- o Mrs. Todd is ready to do spirit wear in case any students are interested.
- o Gint M. Suggested that each teacher provide parents with recommended supplementary tools such as apps to supplement learning at home. Kim S. Suggested we ask teachers to provide links/apps/other suggestions. There are some links available under resources on the school website page.

5. The Lion King Musical:

Rousseau will be presenting the musical, The Lion King. The cast comprises approximately 75 kids. There were 50 tryouts for 15 stage roles. Show dates are May 12, 13, and 14th. Information on ticket sales will be sent out when available.

6. Fun Fair June 3rd (call out for committee/set date for first meeting):

- The first planning meeting will take place on Monday February 8, 2016 as suggested by Danielle C. The committee needs volunteers in order to run a successful event; in addition a volunteer is needed to organize the silent auction.
- This event raises \$10,000 - \$12,000 for our school.
- An update on the planning meeting will be provided at the next school council meeting.

10. Classroom Reassignments for Future:

- Mr. Gris provided a summary of the reorganization process: Board staff begin predicting school staffing requirements in February prior to school year. There are cap sizes to classrooms. The Superintendent has ultimate approval. In April or May, parents are provided with an opportunity to provide the school with information about their child that the school might not already know so that the school can consider this information when composing classes.
- Students find out placements at end of school year. Student enrollment data is reviewed the first Monday after school starts in September. The following week schools are notified if there will be changes. All changes are to be put in place by October.
- Parents questioned whether or no reorganization could be avoided if students were not made aware of their classroom placements until September.
- Parents want to know how we can minimize impacts on children that must go through reorganization.
- Laura H. inquired if school council can rally HWDSB since ultimately this is a board decision.

Action: Laura H. to lead committee to put forth a summary of concerns/suggestions for Classroom Reassignments to HWDSB on behalf of School Council
