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**Meeting Summary**

1. Welcome to all – Kim Strecker
2. Approval of Minutes - February 2016 School Council minutes are posted on the Rousseau website; Approval of minutes motioned by Laura H. and seconded by Kim S.
3. Tastebuds and Student Nutrition Program
  - a. 171 Programs across Hamilton; run by parents/teachers/staff volunteers, offered in 2/3 of Hamilton Public, Catholic, French Public and French Catholic schools. \$.24 minimum costs/student \$.60. Not responding to economic poverty – it is nutrition poverty. Program to model healthy eating. Not fully funded – Ministry funds 15%, Tastebuds does funding(raising) to provide. Partnerships with Lococo’s, cheese wiggles. Bin is provided for each class 2/3 days/week. Public School Gordon Price does 2 food group snack 2X/week. 7% poverty at Rousseau

## 5. Principal's Report

- a. Welcome and Thank you
- b. Air Quality Update – Jr. wing exhaust fans fixed over March break and is now operational. Testing was performed using a portable monitor and the school is showing "Normal" level readings (Board target is 1000 and we are within the target levels). Testing for particulates in the air – "Standard Test"
 

**ACTION ITEM:** John G. to follow up on what the Standard test involves
- c. Asbestos Update/Basketball Court Update
  - i. Asbestos Update – review conducted by John G. and Tony G. and tiles with issues have been identified for repair/removal. "A" Team to come into school (proper abatement procedures followed) to remove problem tiles.

- ii. Basketball Court Update – holes in outdoor Basketball court will be fixed (paving)

**ACTION ITEM:** John G. to confirm procedures to be taken in removal (e.g. off school hours, containment procedures of the area, etc.)

- d. Continuous Learning & Improvement – currently partnering with CH Bray on Learning Math – skill development. Working to ensure students understand conceptually. John shared a video by Jo Boaler (Stanford Mathematics professor) “IM2 Math – Everyone Can Do Math” <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KdE2VvvsfM4>.
- e. Learning Styles – New cost of \$150US to enter names into software in order to continue use. John asked if this would be covered by raised funds or H&S? Approach purposed would be to have Jr. students (4-6) complete online, and Primary students complete a hard copy (by/with parent). This has yet to be discussed at the Staff meeting. Question regarding platform/database this is on and whether the data captured could be extracted (e.g. excel) for use in other tools. Can this information be printed from the software and attached to the Ontario Student Record.

**ACTION:** John to present this to the staff and follow up on software questions (e.g. ability to extract information. School Council has a follow up to determine how to fund the additional \$150US cost (Laura).

#### 6. Budget Report – Laura

- a. As of end of February 2017 ~ \$1800 in School Council bank accts, ~\$368 in Popcorn account – much of these funds have been earmarked for approved spend (e.g. Art Auction, Science Fair, Grad, Outdoor Garden Project, etc.)
- b. Funds allocated for Teacher spend – teachers are spending, but council would like approved funds to be spent by April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017 otherwise funds will be reallocated.
- c. \$10/child kindergarten student has been earmarked for either a trip or visitor.

#### 7. Home and School Meeting Updates

- a. Rousseau Movie night March 31<sup>st</sup> – free event with donations accepted at the door – concessions will be sold and any funds raised will also be donated. Funds raised will be given to 541 Eatery and Exchange (in Hamilton) – guest speaker will be present to provide some background on 541 Eatery and show a short video.
- b. April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2017 – Booster Juice day (Orders to be placed on School Cash Online by April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017)

- c. April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2017 – Groove-a-thon

8. Ancaster Pupil Accommodation Review – Gint
- a. 10 options to be presented to the Board of Trustees – as a community member representative, Gint indicated that the guiding principles that were followed for Rousseau was to continue to have Rousseau open, that a new school should be built and that there should be a max of 400 pupils – this is to maintain the integrity of Rousseau Elementary and the maintaining the “village” feel of Ancaster and Rousseau.
  - b. The Initial staff option presented was modified slight (as applicable to Rousseau), in that the initial option proposed an “addition” to Rousseau; however, the modified proposal recommends a “new build” for Rousseau
  - c. Trustees are still responsible for the final decision (regardless of options and recommendations)
