4.1	Virtual Grade 7/8 Open House & Student Success updates	Cherie Mills (student success lead teacher)	 November 25th—first grade 7/8 open house. Will be virtual, using Teams Live. Power point will be available on the school website afterwards. Link was sent to principals last week and will be resent on Nov 25. Kids that are engaged in the online learning process are doing very well this year. Kids who are not engaging well are doing poorly—marks are bimodal (not too many in the middle). Math homework help beginning in December. Starts at 2:35. Available to any student needing help with math homework. EQAO still happening in January Volunteer hours—students graduating in 2021 only need 20 volunteer hours to graduate. All students can now have parents/neighbours sign off on their hours if they are assisting with tasks (can be babysitting, shovelling driveways, etc) Does not have to be from a charitable organization anymore. Many variables need to be considered. Likely it would look very different—would still have exams. Need to consider the impact of missing social interactions. The school is tracking student progress but it is difficult to compare successes since there are multiple variables. There was an e-learning program prior to COVID. Will have to approach future e-learning cautiously but it will be considered once regular schooling resumes. Is it possible to have virtual clubs? Board has said no athletics and no extra curriculars at this time. Ms Nicolaides has had a meeting about school culture and is hoping to create some activities/generate some school spirit for students.
