Volunteer Job Descriptions and Opportunities

Use the job descriptions listed below to help you choose a position you would like to volunteer for. Volunteer shifts will be assigned on a first come, first service basis. You may volunteer in more than one area and as often as you wish. Every effort will be made to accommodate your selection when the schedules are completed. We appreciate your understanding if we place you in an area that was not your first choice.

Shift duration = minimum 4 hours with the option to add additional hours Peach Festival

Runners (1 – 2 volunteers per shift)

 Retrieving supplies from the refrigerator truck and/or ice trailer for various food and beverage stations/assembly areas

Beverage Tent (2 – 3 volunteers per shift)

- Issuing customers various beverage options water and pop
- Replenish supplies from the truck
- Make change for customers
- Work in tandem with volunteers taking customer orders for food

Optimist Deli (3 – 4 volunteers per shift)

- Preparation of cold sandwiches/wraps
- Buns are delivered fresh each morning so volunteers will be responsible for pre-cutting buns that day
- Ingredients are kept refrigerated outside of time when they are being prepared
- Volunteers to identify for Runners when replenishment of supplies from refrigerated truck is required

Fries/Poutine Assembly (3 – 4 volunteers per shift)

- Prepare poutine and chili cheese taters as required from customer orders
- One table for trays of fries, and two crock pots for gravy and chili and product containers
- Replenishment of items as required
- Make every effort to be consistent in the size of each serving

Server Station (3 – 4 volunteers per shift)

- Receiving orders from customer
- Interaction where necessary with BBQ station and cash to confirm orders
- Monitoring of serviettes, forks, condiments, etc.
- Regular cleaning of front area to maintain and cleanliness and a neat appearance
