3.1	6:40 - 6:50	Principal's Report	Kara	 Sept 25 our school had a bomb threat Nora Frances had already had 2 the week before Prior to the bomb threat there was a meeting at 10:30 with the principal with regards to bomb threat protocol as well as confirming evacuation sites 12:20 the school was ordered to evacuate There are 3 different areas outside to evacuate to where students check in Which site the student goes to depends on where they are when told to evacuate There is police protocol in place which was last updated 2016 with regards to if and when to call police in different situations A bomb threat is an automatic call to 911 The superintendent told the school to leave the grounds and go to the evacuation sites Any belongings left in the school were kept overnight for retrieval purposes Staff are to scan rooms, for staff and or students and make sure the building is clear School buses were driven to the field for students who are bussed, they left the evacuation sites and returned There are teachers designated to help along the way, as this can be quite stressful and there are also high needs students who require help the principal is not responsible for communication to parents during these kinds of events Communication comes from the board First responders are there to keep the community away and ensure the safety of everyone Banner alerts are put on the website, 	Update
