Preparing for your 2024/2025 OSAP application

Dependent Students:

- Your parent(s)/guardian(s) 2023 tax information*
- You and your parent(s)/guardian(s) SIN#'s

*If your parent(s)/guardian(s) are separated or divorced you will indicate this in your application and would use the household income information where you currently live or from those who last supported you.

Independent Students:

- Your Sin # and your spouse SIN # (if applicable)
- Your 2023 tax information and your spouses (if applicable)
- Child care expenses (if applicable)

OSAP is open to **Ontario Residents** of any age who are:


- Canadian Citizens

- Protected Persons

*must be enrolled in approved postsecondary institution taking an approved program






The first time you apply to OSAP you will register and create your profile

Mandatory Module: Get to know OSAP



Introduction

Need help paying for college or university? The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) may be able to help.

Before you begin your OSAP application, you will need to complete a short information session.

This session will help you understand:

- How OSAP works
- Your roles and responsibilities if you become an OSAP recipient
- Basic financial information (e.g., creating a budget, understanding credit and debt) to support you through your postsecondary education


At the end of each section you will be asked to answer a question about the information you just read. You will need to answer the question correctly in order to move to the next section. You can log in and out of the module at any time, and your progress will be saved.

Paying back your student debt

While you are in school, your loan is interest-free and payment-free.



Once you graduate or leave full-time studies, interest will be charged on your loan but you don't need to make any loan payments.



After 6 months, you will have to start making payments on your loan.



Tip! You can make a payment to your student loan even while in school to get ahead





Apply early

It takes time for document approvals and final assessments. Use August 1 (or sooner) as a "guideline" date for September start.

- Be honest with financial information reported.
- Check your OSAP regularly
 Check out the Message Centre of your OSAP account for updates and info
- Create a Budget! Don't waste your OSAP money on Fancy Purses or a huge TV it is intended for school!
- Still don't have enough money?
 Speak to your college/university financial advisor; there may be options available!





Getting the money!

- OSAP funding is released in two installments: the first when you start your study period (usually in September) the rest in next semester
- Funds will first be sent to the school you are attending to help pay towards outstanding tuition/fees for one semester
- If there are any remaining funds for the semester they will be deposited to the bank account you provided when you registered with NSLSC

5 Ways to Pay for College/University!!




- **Saving up!** If you've saved enough to self-fund your postsecondary costs and can avoid loans etc. good for you!
