2025 Valedictorian Nomination Information

What is a Valedictorian and who is a good candidate?

A *Valedictorian* is a student who is part of the graduating class who delivers the Valedictory Address at Commencement.

A *Valedictory Address* is generally considered the final farewell to classmates before they leave high school to pursue their individual paths after Commencement.

Any student who is part of the *graduating class* is eligible to run for Valedictorian. *NEW THIS YEAR* Students may apply in pairs, as long as the criteria below are met by BOTH candidates.

In general, a good *candidate* for Valedictorian is someone who:

- ✓ is <u>well-rounded</u>, showing success in academics, involvement in school events and extracurriculars, and a good representation of the school in the wider community
- can <u>represent the graduating class</u> well and can <u>positively reflect</u> on several aspects of what life at Saltfleet was like from the perspective of a student
- ✓ feels comfortable speaking in front of a large audience
- ✓ is <u>not returning</u> to Saltfleet next year

So you want to be Valedictorian? Here's what you need to do:

Record a short video (no longer than 3 minutes) to <u>introduce yourself</u> and <u>explain</u> why you are a good candidate for Valedictorian. If applying in a pair, both candidates must be in the same video.

Here are some things you could discuss:

- Why you are a well-rounded student and good representation of the Saltfleet graduating class
- Your leadership skills and how you contribute to the school and wider community
- A reflection on your time as a Saltfleet student
- Inspiring advice for your fellow graduates' future endeavours

All parts of your video must be school-appropriate!

Please be sure you are clearly SEEN and HEARD in your video. Suggestions for a clear video:

- Keep yourself centered in the shot
- Reduce background noise as much as possible
- No props, gimmicks, movement, or other distractions
- Speak slowly and include pauses between ideas
- Review your video to be sure your message is complete

How do I Submit my Video?

Your video must be uploaded to <u>OneDrive</u> with your <u>full name(s) and "Valedictorian Nomination Video" as</u> <u>the title</u> (e.g. Joe English Valedictorian Nomination Video).

Once uploaded, share your video with **Ms. Lindy Stewardson** (Isteward@hwdsb.on.ca) **AND Ms. Cristina Cerqueira-Smith** (ccerquei@hwdsb.on.ca). Make sure that you set the permissions to allow viewer access.

Nomination Videos are due by 11:59PM on Monday April 28th, 2025. Late submissions will not be accepted.

Next Steps:

- A staff committee will select 3-4 candidates based on the video submissions
- Successful candidates will be informed via e-mail.
- Successful candidates will then prepare a short speech that they will deliver live at the Commencement Breakfast in May. Instructions for this speech will be provided at a later date.
- Voting for Valedictorian will occur at Commencement Breakfast after the speeches. Students who are not present at Commencement Breakfast CANNOT vote.
- The Valedictorian(s) will be informed via e-mail and have until June to prepare the Valedictory Address for the Commencement Ceremony. The Valedictorian(s) will work with Ms. Stewardson and Ms. Cerqueira-Smith to edit, refine, and practice the Valedictory Address.

All deadlines are <u>FINAL</u> - late submissions will not be accepted
