Client accessibility is paramount in **Community and Continuing Education**. The programs must be provided in the locations where the clients can access them. In addition, the community-based programs generally have adult clients who are returning to complete a secondary school diploma. An “adult environment” is critical for their learning. Connected to this is the need for sufficient space for effective pathway planning and program offerings.

Care, Treatment and Corrections (Section 23) programs operate in various locations across the region. These programs are “owned” by community partners and through Section agreements with the Ministry, HWDSB provides teachers. Currently there are five classrooms used at Vincent Massey by community partners.

Gateway is our HWDSB program for students who are on long term suspensions or expulsions.

Supervised Alternative Learning (formerly known as SALEP) is a process that results in a placement for a student at either their home school or at the SAL Centre at Crestwood. Generally these students require re-engagement to attend school.

System **Alternative Education** is provided as a Tier 3 intervention for a student who requires an environment outside of his/her home school, for a limited period of time. The goal is to ultimately transition the student back to his/her home school.
