

NUTRITION BREAKS

At Shannen Koostachin we are on a balanced day schedule. **Our first Nutrition Break begins at 11:10-11:50 AM**. At this time students will alternate going outside for 20 minutes and reporting to their lunch room to have their morning snack. **Our second Nutrition Break begins at 1:30- 2:10 PM**.

Any Grade 7 and 8 students wishing to leave the school property for lunch will need to have authorization completed first, by parent, on the parent portal prior to leaving the school.

*Unless it is outside time, all students are to remain inside their classroom for the eating portion of break, to ensure student safety.

*Grade 7-8 students leaving property to go out for lunch are permitted to do so on SECOND BREAK ONLY.

CELLPHONES/ ELECTRONIC DEVICES



One area of particular concern that we have been experiencing is the growing use of cell phones/electronic devices and smartwatches during instructional time in the classroom setting.

Our goal is and has always been to maximize the learning time for our students and ensure a positive learning environment. Devices have many positive uses. However, in the classroom setting they are an enormous distraction to learning. There is research studies that cite the negative effects of cell phone use on students, particularly the overuse of social media. We have found that cell phones not only distract students from learning, but also facilitate negative behavior such as:

- Cyberbullying
- 🗆 Harassment
- $\hfill\square$ Taking photos or videos of students and staff without their permission
- Accessing unapproved websites
- □ Arranging meetings with friends in the restrooms during class time

The sincere hope is that you have a conversation with your child(ren) about the acceptable time and use of their cell phones and other devices during the school day. Prior to entering school, students should have their cell phones on silent and stored in the safe space provided in the classroom. Students who disregard this policy may be subject to disciplinary consequences including confiscation of devices or a phone call to parents.

Please note that if you need to contact your child during the school day, our Office Administrator and Assistants are available to take your call and pass on the message to your child(ren). Thank you for your continued support as we work to reduce classroom distractions and provide our students with the best learning environment possible.

TRANSPORTATION

It is important that your child remains at school until the final bell at 3:50 p.m. Please keep in mind, as a courtesy to teachers, the learning of students, and the office, which can be a very busy place, that <u>early dismissals do cause interruptions to class</u>. If you need to pick up your child from school early, due to an appointment, we remind you to please allow some extra time for your child to arrive at the office. Students will be called down once you are here and it can take a few minutes for your child(ren) to gather there things and get to the office area. Please let your child(ren)s classroom teacher know, ahead of time, if you will picking up early and the time so they can ensure that your child is ready.

PARKING LOT



A reminder that our school parking lot is for staff only and the driveway will be closed off for traffic during school drop off and pick up to ensure all of our safety and access for our buses. Street parking is available at the front and to the side of our building, please note that this can get very busy at drop off and pick up and we encourage all those students who are able to walk/bike to do so. This will ease the congestion of the traffic in our area and keep everyone safe.

SAFE WELCOME SCHOOLS

As you may know, HWDSB initiated a Safe Welcome Program in 2013. The program supports a welcoming learning environment by ensuring that parents and other authorized visitors can access elementary schools while keeping students and staff safe.

Based on the HWDSB safe welcome program, exterior school doors must remain locked during the instructional day, and visitors access the school during school hours via the main entrance. You will notice that our main entrance is equipped with a video/intercom access system and signage. The access system allows staff to see and talk with any visitors requesting entry into the school. The system also allows school office staff to electronically release the lock on the door.

Please note that we will continue to ask visitors to report to the office for sign-in. Principals maintain ultimate authority for visitors admitted into their school. If you have any questions about the program or the system, please contact the office.
