

PRIMARY (THIS & THAT)...



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CELLPHONES/ ELECTRONIC DEVICES



Our goal is and has always been to maximize the learning time for our students and ensure a positive learning environment. Devices have many positive uses. However, in the classroom setting they are an enormous distraction to learning. There is research studies that cite the negative effects of cell phone use on students, particularly the overuse of social media. We have found that cell phones
not only distract students from learning, but also facilitate negative behavior such as:
□ Cyberbullying
□ Harassment
□ Taking photos or videos of students and staff without their permission
□ Accessing unapproved websites
□ Arranging meetings with friends in the restrooms during class time
The sincere hope is that you have a conversation with your child(ren) about the acceptable time and use of their cell phones and other devices during the school day. Prior to entering school, students should have their cell phones on silent and stored in the safe space provided in the classroom. Students who disregard this policy may be subject to disciplinary consequences including confiscation of devices or a phone call to parents.
Please note that if you need to contact your child during the school day, our Office Administrator and Assistants are available to take your call and pass on the message to your child(ren). Thank you for your continued support as we work to reduce classroom distractions and provide our students with the best learning environment possible.

SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION REMINDER

If your child qualifies for transportation, please follow the steps listed to access your child(ren)'s information via the online portal. Go to www.hamiltonschoolbus.ca and click on the "Parent Portal" on the Home page, OR "Bus Stop Finder" on the landing page.

* As a reminder to students— please be at your bus stops ready for pick up 10 mins early (as busses can be running 10 mins early or late depending on circumstances)

*Please note the school does not contact parents regarding late busses.

Parents are encouraged to check online at <u>HWSTS</u> to check for bus delays.

PARKING LOT

A reminder that our school parking lot is for staff only and the driveway will be closed off for traffic during school drop off and pick up to ensure all of our safety and access for our buses. Street parking is available at the front and to the side of our building, please note that this can get very busy at drop off and pick up and we encourage all those students who are able to walk/bike to do so. This will ease the congestion of the traffic in our area and keep everyone safe.

ADDRESSING A CONCERN

Students and families with classroom concerns are encouraged to contact their student's classroom teacher as the first method of communication regarding the concern. It is with hope that this will rectify the situation before further escalation.

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SCHOOL BEGINS AT 9:30 a.m. and ENDS AT 3:50 p.m.

Students can be dropped off on the back school ground as early as 9:15 a.m. This is when a duty teacher/supervisor will be present.

If your child is late for school, please bring your child to the main office and they will be supported in getting to their classroom.

If you know your child will be late or absent for the day please ensure that you put this into School Messenger that can be found on the board website or the App can be downloaded to your phone.

Also, a friendly reminder to parents to please remain outside of the fence during morning drop off at the school as the school day needs to begin promptly when the morning bell goes.

EARLY PICK UP...

It is important that your child remains at school until the final bell at 3:50 p.m. Please keep in mind, as a courtesy to teachers, the learning of students, and the office, which can be a very busy place, that early dismissals do cause interruptions to class. If you need to pick up your child from school early, due to an appointment, we remind you to please allow some extra time for your child to arrive at the office. Students will be called down once you are here and it can take a few minutes for your child(ren) to gather there things and get to the office area. Please let your child(ren)s classroom teacher know, ahead of time, if you will picking up early and the time so they can ensure that your child is ready.
