### **HIGH SCHOOL FORMAT**

- 2 Semesters: September to January and February to June
- 4 courses each semester (first 4 in Semester I and remaining 4 in semester 2)
- Examinations and/or culminating activities at the end of each semester
- 4 classes per day
- Each class is 75 minutes long



### **OSSD REQUIREMENTS**

- 30 credits
  - 18 Compulsory
  - 12 Elective
- 40 hours Community Involvement
- Ontario Secondary School Literacy Requirement (OSSLT or OSSLC)
- 2 eLearning Courses (able to opt out)





# COMPULSORY COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn the following 15 compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

- 4 English (I at each grade level)
- 3 Mathematics (I at senior level)
- 2 Science
- I French (Core or French Immersion)
- I Canadian History (Grade 10)
- I Canadian Geography (Grade 9)
- I Arts (Visual, Media, Music, Drama)
- I Health and Physical Education
- .5 Civics (Grade 10)
- .5 Career Studies (Grade 10)



### COMPULSORY COURSE REQUIREMENTS

#### Plus one credit from <u>each</u> of the following 3 groups:

- Group I I additional credit in English or French as a second language, or a Native language, or a classical or international language or social sciences & humanities, or Canadian and world studies or guidance & career education or cooperative education.
- Group 2 I additional credit in health and physical education or the arts or business studies or French as a second language or cooperative education.
- Group 3 I additional credit in science (grade I I or I2) or technological education, or French as a second language, or computer studies, or cooperative education.



## COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

## When Can I Complete Community Involvement Hours?

- Starting on July 1st the summer before grade 9.
- Outside scheduled class time; e.g., during lunch breaks/during study periods.
- In the evenings, on weekends, during the summer months.
- Completed community hours can be submitted to the Student Services office in your school as you complete them.



### ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST

- Administered in the spring of the Grade 10 year
- Based on expectations for language and communication up to and including Grade 9
- Accommodations, and deferrals may be appropriate for some students



### **ELEARNING**

- ▶ 2 Credits in Secondary must be eLearning (any grade)
- Can OPT out in Parent Portal (opting out still allows you to take eLearning courses should you wish)



### **COURSE TYPES: GRADES 9 & 10**

In GRADE 9 and 10, courses are offered in 6 categories or course types:

- I. APPLIED ("P")
- 2. ACADEMIC ("D")
- 3. LOCALLY DEVELOPED ("L")
- 4. OPEN ("O")
- 5. GRADE 9 PROGRAM ("W")



### COURSE TYPES: GRADES 9 & 10

### Academic (D)

- These courses focus on essential concepts and include additional related materials. Greater emphasis is placed on theory and abstract thinking than on practical applications as a basis for future learning and problem solving.
- Academic courses in grade 9 & 10 typically lead to University courses in grade 11 & 12



### **COURSE TYPES: GRADES 9 & 10**

### Applied (P)

- These courses focus on essential concepts with greater emphasis placed on practical hands-on applications of concepts.
- Applied courses in grade 9 & 10 typically lead to College courses in grade 11 & 12

#### Open level courses (O)

 An opportunity to explore an area of interest that is appropriate for all students.



## DE-STREAMED COURSES (GRADE 9 ONLY)

#### **Grade 9 De-streamed Program**

- There will NOT be ACADEMIC and APPLIED courses in Math, English, French, Geography or Science in Grade 9
- These courses will allow students to consolidate, and continue to develop, an understanding of concepts and to apply their understanding to culturally responsive and relevant real-world situations.
- These courses may lead to Academic or Applied courses in grade 10

- ► Information and Communication Technology in Business

Most students take their compulsory Arts course in grade 9 DRAMA (ADA101), MUSIC (AMI101) or ART (AVI101)



### **NEXT STEPS**

#### January 2023

- Grade 8 teachers provide support to students selecting options
- Copies of the Option Sheets and Course Descriptors will be posted on the Sherwood Website

#### February 2023

- Students complete
   on-line course option
   selections in XELLO
   and complete a hard
   copy of option sheets
- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to participate in the process with teacher support



### **OPTION PROCESS**

- Grade 8 Teachers should communicate with parents regarding course selections
- Students will Complete a paper copy of the Option Sheet with their parents and return it to their school
- Students will enter their official Course Selections in Xello in mid
   February



### **OPTION PROCESS**

- In February students will enter courses into Xello -Counsellors will assist with this process as needed.
- Deadline for Options to be entered into Xello is March 3rd, 2023
- Xello can be found on the HWDSB Hub
