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


French Immersion vs. Core French

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Program Options: The DELF





Language Intensity

French Immersion

- Over 5 000 Hours of French instruction by the end of grade 8
- Minimum 10 Secondary credits (4 French Language and 6 optional courses)

Core French

- 600 Hours of French instruction by the end of grade 8
- 1 mandatory credit, option to take 4



French Immersion Certificate

VS.

DELF Certificate

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Certificate of French Immersion

- Successful completion of 10 secondary French Immersion credits
 - 4 in the subject of French
 - 6 of their choice from the options offered
- By the end of the four-year program in secondary school, students will:
 - be able to follow their pathway (*Apprenticeship, College, Community Living, University and Work*) with the benefit of French as a Second Language.
- Certificate is provided by School where program was completed and signed by the Head of Department











The DELF

(Diplôme d'études en langue française)



- Internationally recognized certificate that demonstrates an individual's French language proficiency.
- All grade 12 FSL students both Immersion and Core are invited to challenge the exam.
- Students, in consultation with their teacher, will choose the level of DELF to challenge (A2, B1, B2)

DELF Levels of Proficiency

DELF Scolaire A1 A2 B1 B2 Comprehend and use familiar simple words and communicate in frequently of everyday communication abstract conceptions.

Understand the main points of everyday communication and deal with most situations that are familiar or of personal interest.

Understand concrete and abstract concepts and interact with a degree of ease and spontaneity in the target language.

Non-Profit SHSM (French Focus)




Students receive the SHSM (Specialist High Skills Major) seal on their diploma when they:

- complete a specific bundle of 8-10 courses in the student's selected field
- earn industry certifications like first aid and CPR qualifications
- gain important skills on the job through cooperative education placements

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Transportation

 Transportation for French Immersion is offered to secondary students whose in-catchment school exceeds 3.2 kms (HSR student bus pass)

 Where HSR is not available or over 1 hour in length, alternative transportation will be provided (school bus or alternative transportation depending on number of students and location)





Leaving the FI Program

- If students choose to leave the French Immersion Program, they MUST return to their home school (based on address)
- If they wish to remain at Sherwood (and continue in the English stream) they must complete the Out of Catchment Process which happens in the Spring
- Transportation is not provided to out of catchment students
