A separate advisory group (Transition Committee) will be established to address the transition for students and staff of the affected schools.

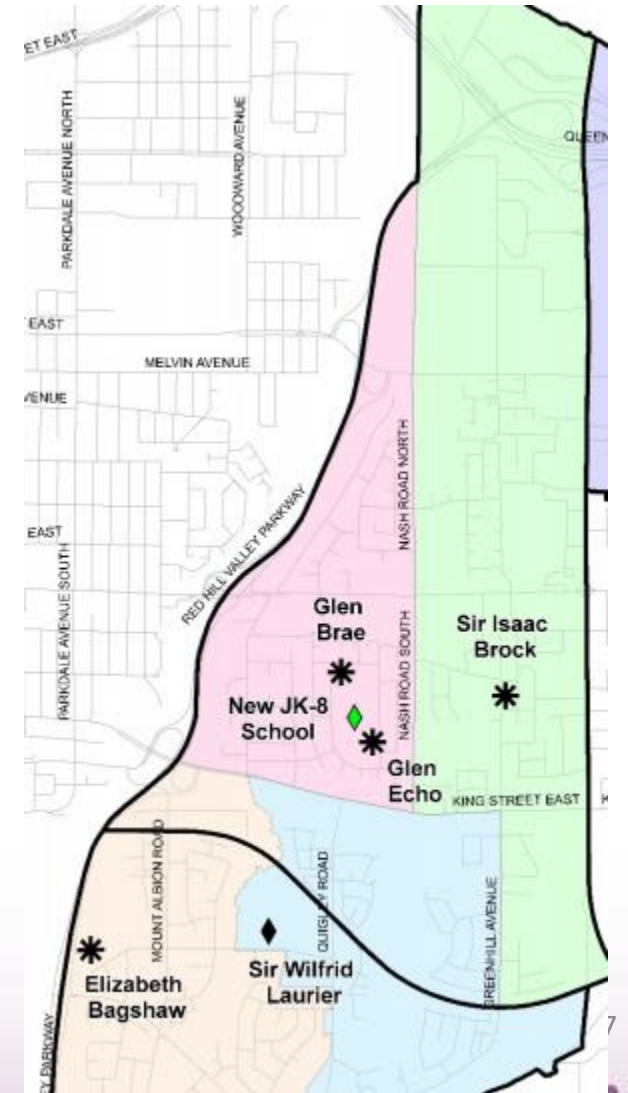
Pupil Accommodation Review Procedure for Policy # 2.5

- Artifacts to be kept and/or traditions to be incorporated into the new school

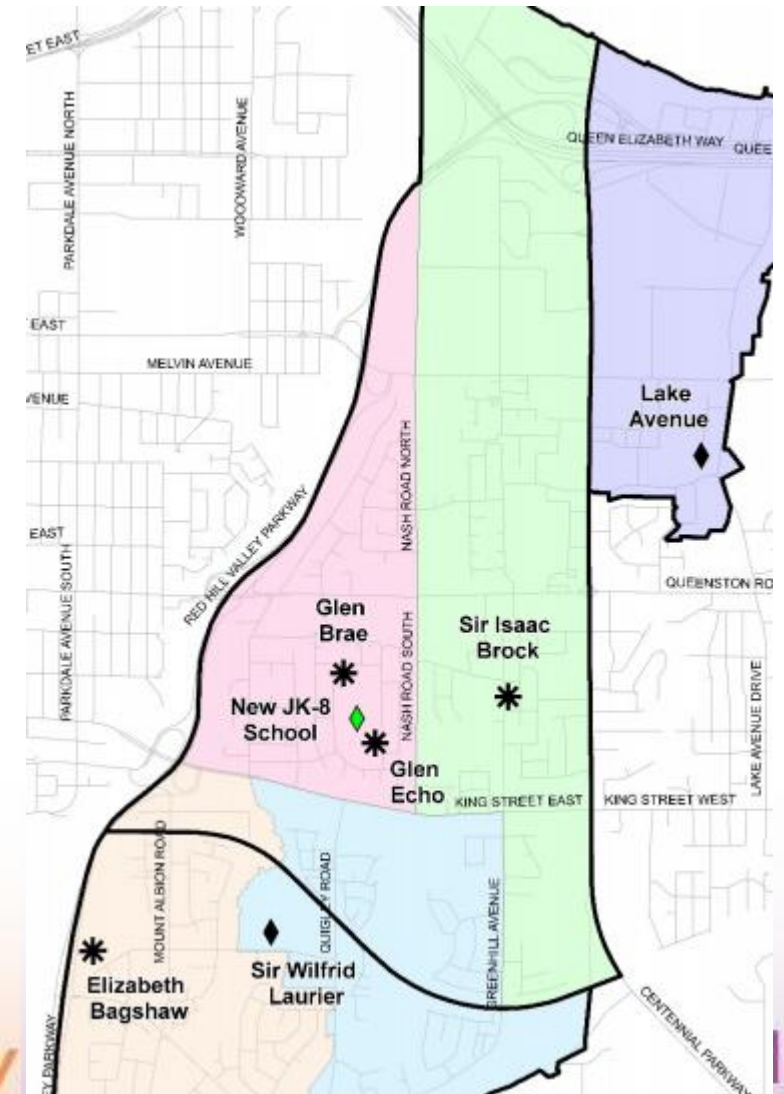
On June 6, 2016, Trustees approved the following with respect to the East Hamilton City 2 Pupil Accommodation Review:

***That Elizabeth Bagshaw, Glen Brae, Glen Echo and Sir Isaac Brock be closed pending Ministry of Education funding for a new JK-8 elementary school on the Glendale Campus and that the boundaries between the new Glendale Campus School and Sir Wilfrid Laurier be modified.***



On June 19, 2017 the Ministry of Education announced funding to build a new 682 pupil place, JK - 8 elementary school beside Glen Brae School.

This new school will accommodate students from Elizabeth Bagshaw, Glen Brae, Glen Echo, Sir Isaac Brock and Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

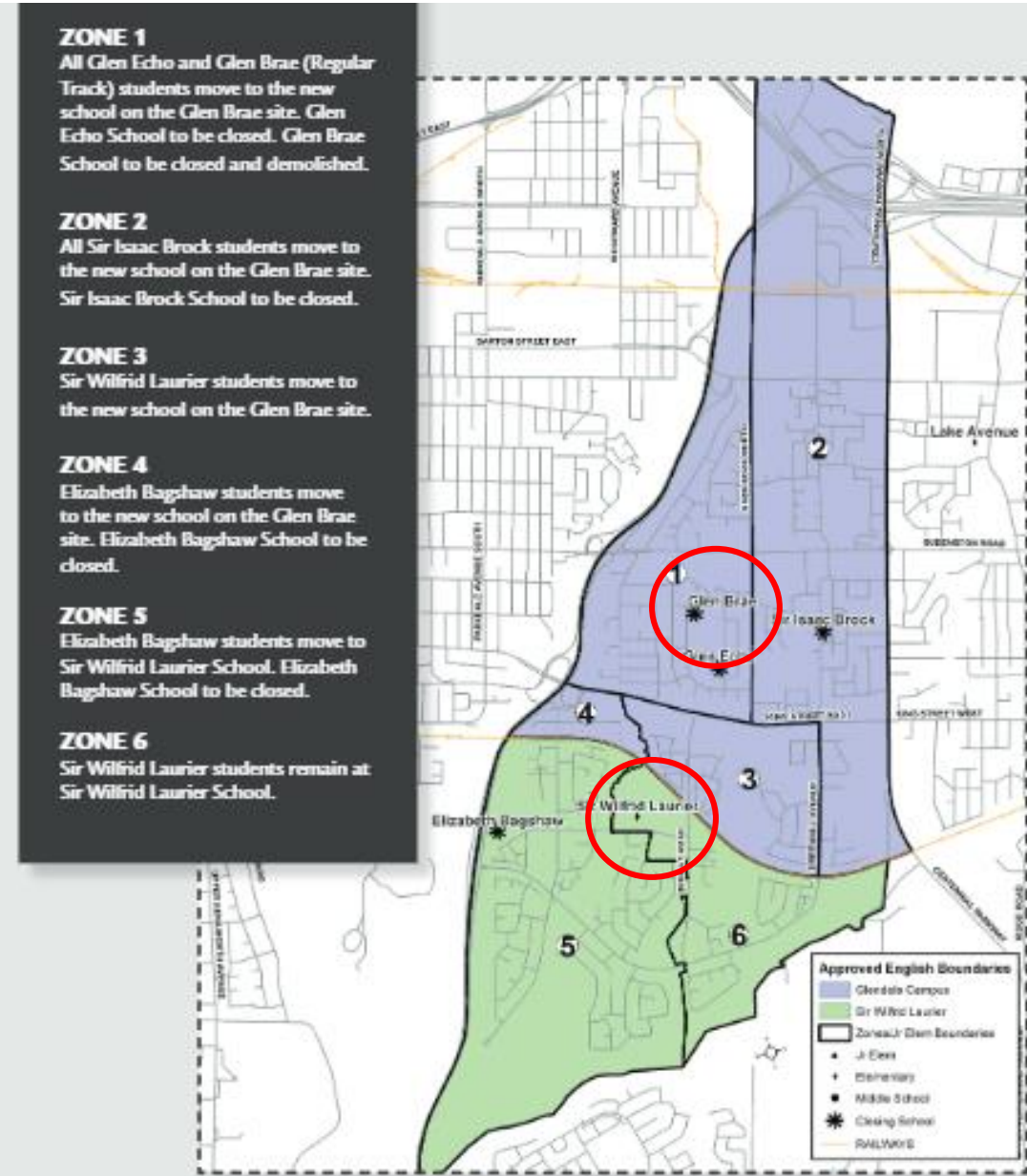




Elizabeth Bagshaw, Glen Brae, Glen Echo and Sir Isaac Brock schools will close at the end of June 2021.

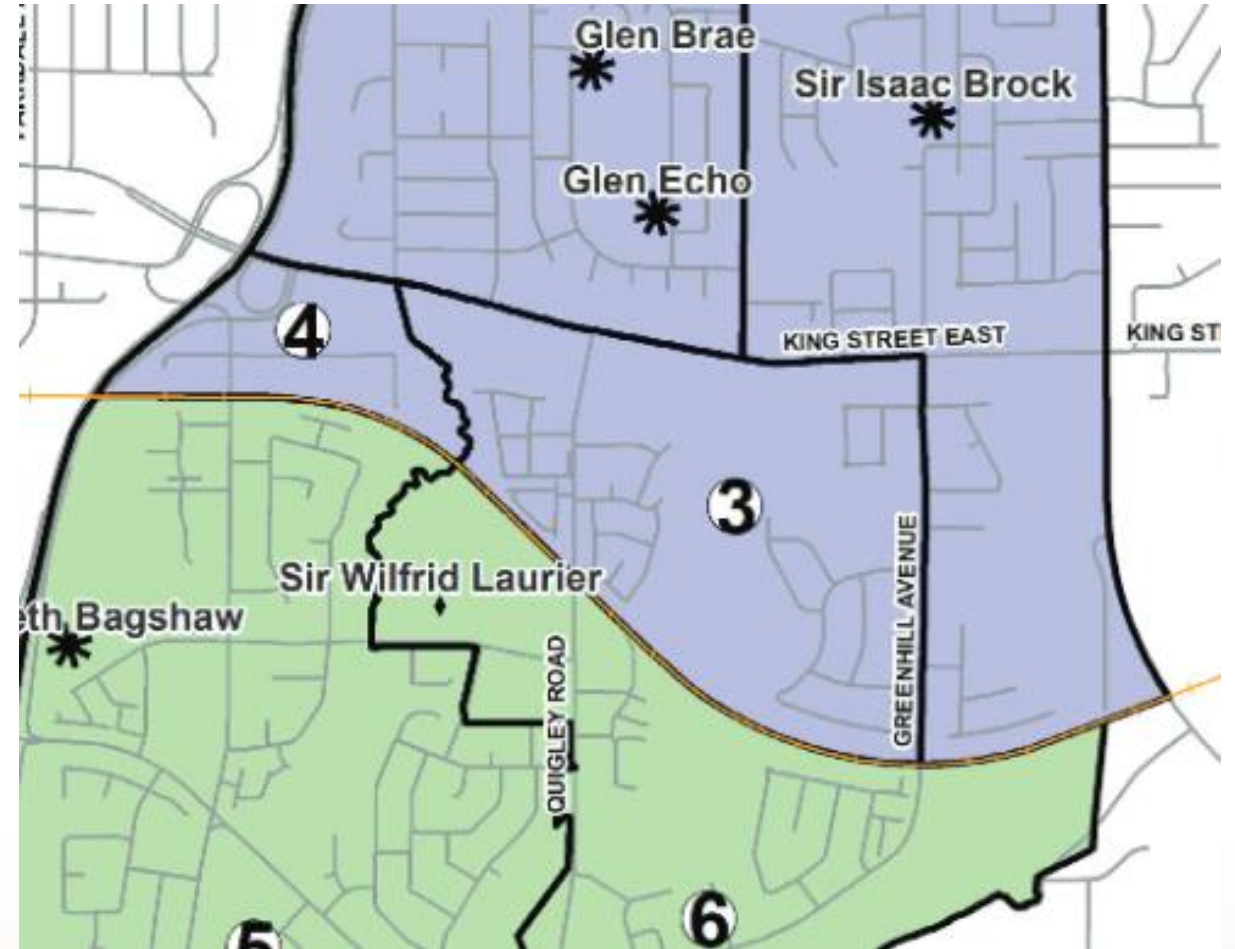
The new school being built beside Glen Brae will open on September 2021.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier will begin September 2021 with a new boundary.



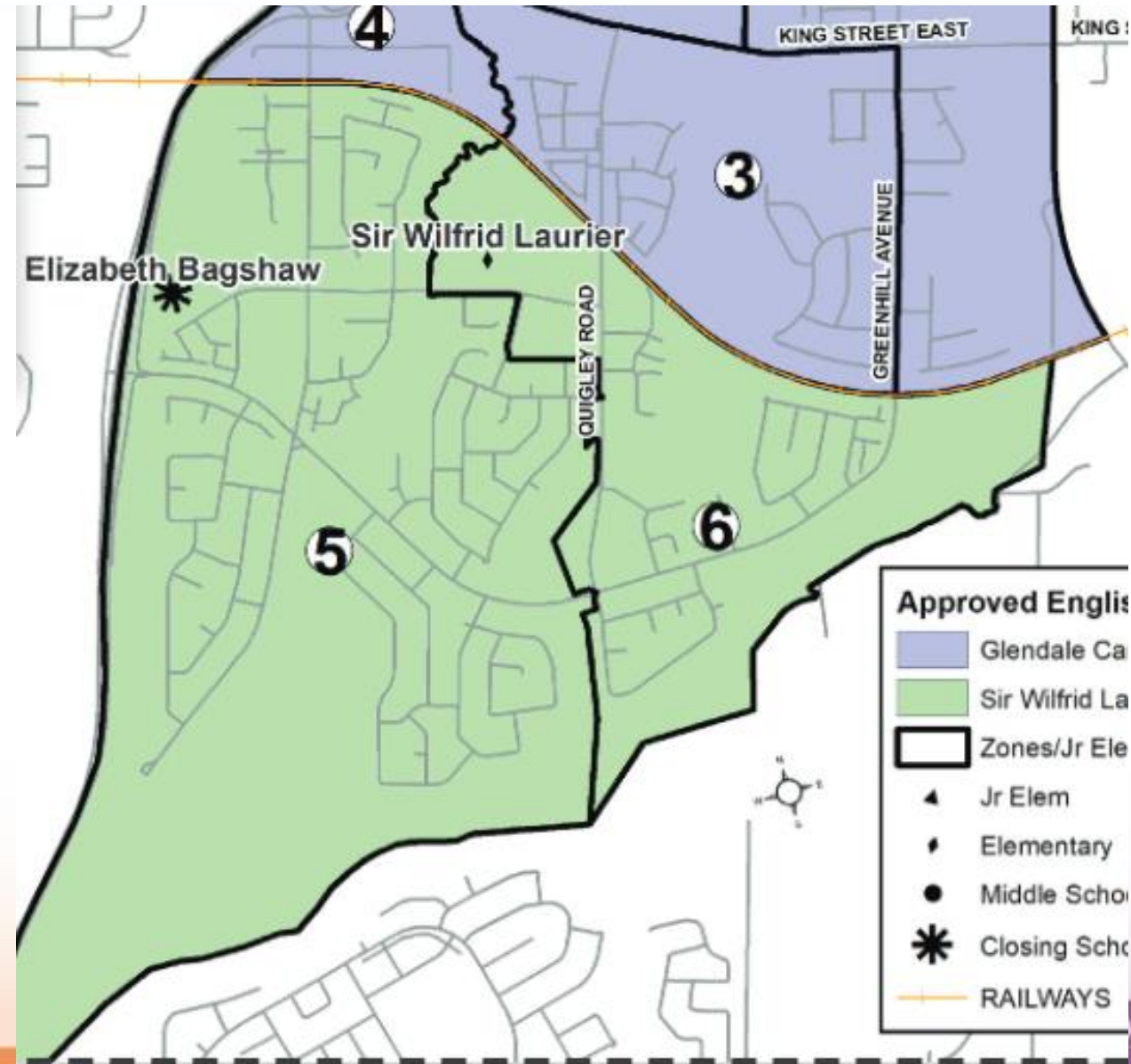
## Zone 3 & 4

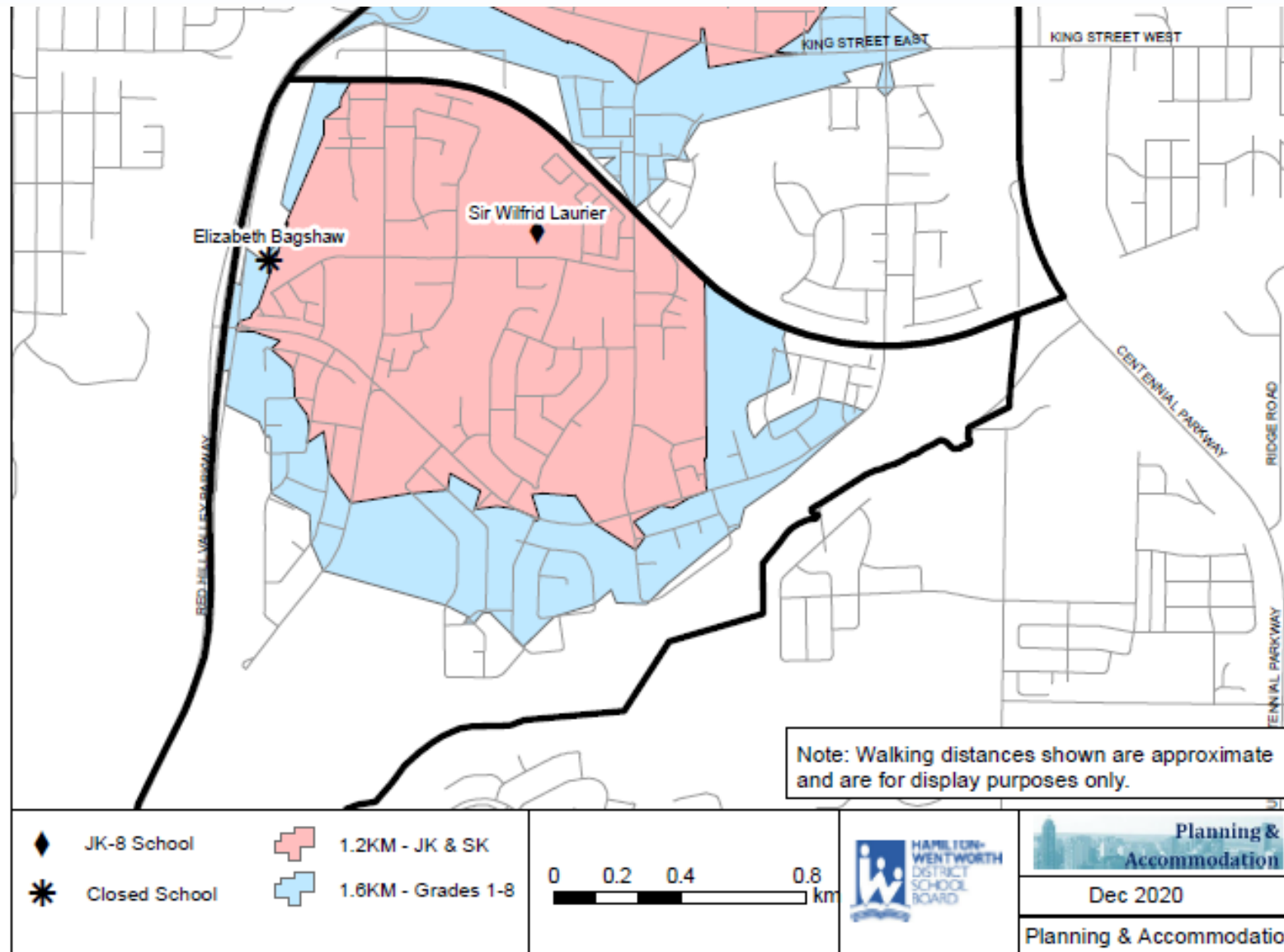
- Students living within Sir Wilfrid Laurier (Zone 3) and Elizabeth Bagshaw (Zone 4) will move to new Glen School for September 2021.

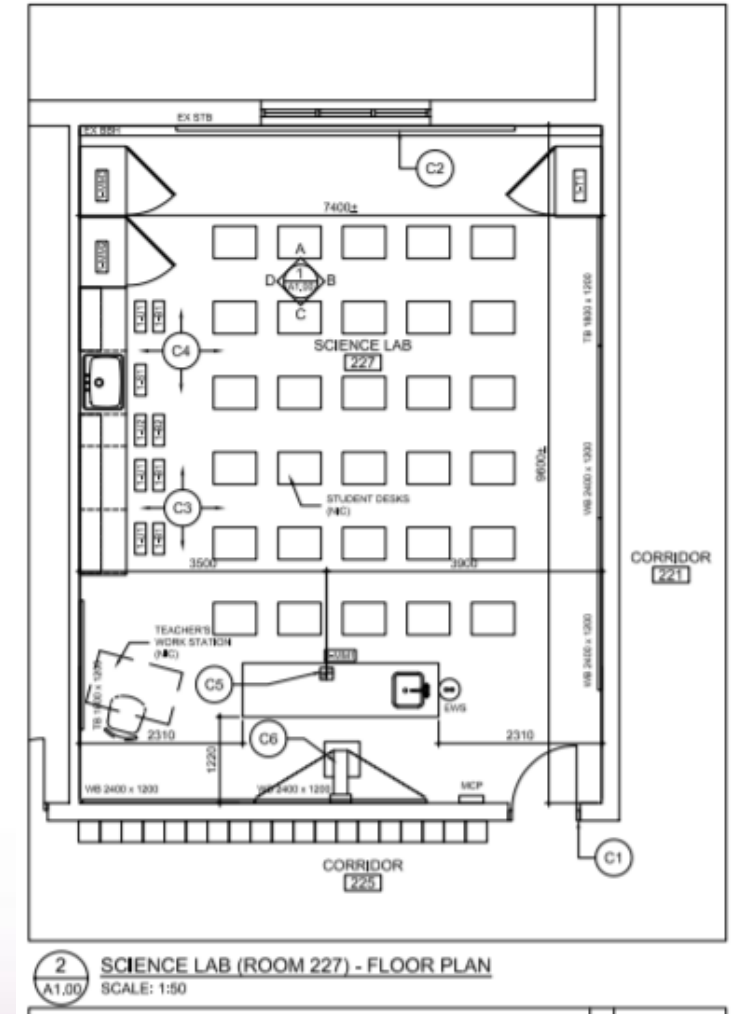
