# Previous Update Class Placements 2023-2024

Information about students' class placements will be shared the week before school begins starting on August 28, 2023 via the Parent Portal. Families may also call the school during this week for information if having complications accessing our Parent Portal. Students with an Individual Education Plan will follow their transition plan with school support.

SWL Elementary School does not accept parental requests for a specific educator or combined grade/single grade. The practice of selecting a specific educator is contrary to all that we believe in terms of respecting all members of the SWL community and learning to work together. With our current focus on grade team planning and implementation of our instructional program, all classes of the same grade will have a similar curriculum focus and delivery. Given that the curriculum will be aligned across the classes in the same grade, parents can be assured that the instructional program their child receives will be of equal caliber across the grade team. We believe it is important for our students to learn how to cooperate and function in an environment with a wide range of personalities and educational philosophies, which is a life-long skill that is imperative to meeting with success in any group or workplace. Finally, combined classes are a reality in education today. Instruction in these classrooms is differentiated to meet the needs of all learners. We take the entire student profile into account before making decisions about student class placements.
