How We Eat & Play Together @SWO *Nutrition Break - 40 minutes, twice a day

Seat & Enjoy Lunch - 20 minutes

- Bring nutritious lunch
- Remain seated and behave with courtesy and respect (table manners, indoor voice)
- Have a quiet activity at your seats if you finish eating early
- Pack up lunch and place garbage in pail & recyclables in blue bin

- Remain in lunchroom until dismissed for active play
- Tuck in chair and exit classroom in an orderly manner

Active & Respectful Play - 20 minutes

- Respect the fenced in boundaries. The hill is for sitting on only, no running or rolling games.
- Playground equipment comes from classrooms or the Active Recess bin.
- Only safe play (no tackling/play fighting).
- Students entering the building need permission from an on-duty staff person.
- All food items are to remain in locker.
- For black top recesses students may use 4 squares, and small area games only.

Code of Conduct

School Device Procedures

- 1. Devices are to be used for educational purposes only.
 - Teacher signals when devices may be used during class.
 - "Screens down" means you need to put your device face down.
- 2. Recording (videos, pictures) of anyone without permission will result in progressive discipline.
- 3. Devices are not to be used during nutrition break.
- 4. No devices use at lockers or when walking in the hallways.
 - No accessing your device while traveling from class including earbuds.
- 5. No devices in the bathrooms or changerooms.

Grade 5-8 students with parent / caregiver permission may choose to bring devices to school to support their learning. This is not an expectation as devices can and will be provisioned for learning. In order to support and secure these valuable tools, students are permitted to access their lockers before and after PE, DPA or fitness on the stage.

LOCKERS

The school cannot accept responsibility for the security of any personal materials. Lockers remain school property, and will be inspected as necessary to maintain a clean and safe school environment. In cases of suspected wrongdoing, lockers may be searched using established Police/School Board protocol.

- I will have a combination lock on my locker if I am in grades 5, 6, 7 or 8 and I will give a copy of my combination to my teacher (key locks ARE NOT permitted).
- I will retrieve all necessary equipment at the beginning of the day or at Nutritional Breaks so that I am prepared for classes and lunch.
- I will not go to my locker between classes or once I've entered my lunchroom.
- I will keep my locker clean and organized and free of unwanted food.

Getting To and From SWO Active Transportation To and From School

Students walking to and from school are asked to use the 'buddy' system and follow all traffic signals. For the safety of all students and guests, students bicycling or scooting or blading or boarding are asked to dismount and walk their bike, blade, board on school property. Bikes & Scooters, Boards and Blades need to be stored and locked properly in designated areas i.e racks or lockers. If you choose to bring your bike, scooter, blades or board, you are responsible for the care and well-being of it.

Busing

Excusals / Lates

If you are to be excused early during the day:

Step 1: You must present a note from your parent / caregiver to the teacher at the start of the day.

Step 2: Come to the office, first thing in the morning, to get an excusal slip

Valuables/Lost and Found

Expensive and valuable items such as electronic devices, jewellery, and large sums of money, skateboards/ rollerblades and scooters are brought to school at your own risk.

Valuables (i.e. jewellery & glasses) are generally turned in to the school office if they are found. Clothing items are placed in the lost and found box located outside of Room 102.

General Information for Parents / Caregivers

ANAPHYLAXIS

Parents are required, under the Anaphylaxis Policy Directive, to inform the school, in writing, if their child has severe, life threatening allergies, as confirmed by a physician, as we need to ensure that safety precautions are put into place.

Sir William Osler is PEANUT/NUT SAFE, as we have several students with life threatening allergies to peanuts and/or nuts. Please do not send your child with any peanut or nut products for lunch, snacks, or special occasion treats. Working together we can ensure the safety of all of our children.

ENTERING/LEAVING SCHOOL

Entry is by the designated back doors only. Exit is by the front doors. ALL parents and visitors to the school MUST report to the office to sign.

INCLEMENT WEATHER/SCHOOL CLOSURE

In the event of severe weather conditions during the winter months, or events out of the control of SWO or the HWDSB, students and families are requested to listen to local radio stations (900 CHML, 1150 CKOC, 820 CHAM, or 102.9 K-Lite FM), tune in to CHCH TV (Channel 11 – CH Morning LIVE), call the Emergency Closure Hotline (905-521-2535) or check the Board website @ www.hwdsb.on.ca for information on school closures.

MEDICATION

Please note we must have your written permission, Doctor's signature (on the approved form), and the <u>original</u> prescription bottle properly labeled in order to dispense or supervise the intake of medication for your child. Forms are available at the main office if your child requires medication. Please note that permission MUST BE RENEWED at the beginning of every school year.

NO DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

To support the safety and well-being of all, there are no dogs allowed on school grounds between 6:00AM and 6:00PM.

NO SMOKING ON SCHOOL PROPERTY
