
## Black History Month

What IS Black History Month?




Black History Month is a month where we learn about the past. It is a celebration of the things black people have done to stand up for their rights.

Rosa Parks was a black woman. One day she sat on the bus on her way home from a stressful day at work in the 'coloured' section were she was supposed to be. The bus got more and more filled with white passengers, and some of them were standing. The bus driver moved back the sign separating black people from white people and asked Rosa and 3 other black passengers to give up their seats. The three others did but Rosa refused to move. The driver called the police and got her arrested for standing up for her rights.
