Tastebuds (Snack Program)	 Guest attendant and speaker: Bhairavi Kumar Tastebuds is a collaboration with Dundas local businesses/ farms to provide nutritious snacks for students in need – goal is for the money to stay in the community Funding received through provincial government, but fundraising is required Started in 2008 in high-needs schools now feeds more than 23,000 students a day Universal program – any kid in the school can participate in the program (budget for every child in the school but not every child will use) Program differs in each school based on support received by school – mostly it is volunteer run Receive \$0.15 per dollar from the province – everything else comes from fundraising Demand has raised for the program since COVID Free apples provided this year through the "Great Big Crunch" – promoting food literacy 	ВВ
