Background

Successful capital project submissions have brought HWDSB about \$220 million since 2012, allowing us to build two new secondary schools, nine new elementary schools and several significant additions and/or renovations at 12 other schools.











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Anticipated Growth


This new school would be a replacement school for Tapleytown, which is only rated for a capacity of 291 students and is estimated to need \$5 million in renewal needs. Student enrolment in the Tapleytown catchment area is projected to significantly outgrow the school's capacity.

New Site

One project proposed was a new elementary school in **Upper Stoney Creek that** would welcome students in Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8. HWDSB owns a 6.2 acre site for this new school, at the intersection of Green Mountain Road West and First Road West.

5 Kindergarten rooms

20 Regular classrooms

1 Art room

1 Music room

1 Science room

Gym with change rooms

Learning commons

Childcare





Childcare Facilities

The proposed new building will include a 3-room child care centre which will accommodate 49 licenced child care spaces. There will be 1 infant, 1 toddler and 1 preschool room constructed.




Process & Timelines

In terms of timing, it is important to remember that building a new school involves many steps, each of which takes time. These include:

- 1. Identification and purchase of property November 2020
- 2. Funding from Ministry approved December 2021
- 3. Design and budget for construction
- 4. Approval to Proceed from the Ministry
- 5. Site plan approval from City
- 6. Tendering process for General Contractor
- 7. Approval to Proceed from Ministry (if bid exceeds approved budget)
- 8. Construction 12-16 months

We will update the community as details are confirmed, but are working toward a January 2025 opening date, at the earliest.
