## Celebrating the International Day of Persons with Disabilities

The International Day of Persons with Disabilities takes place on December 3<sub>rd</sub> of each year. This is the first year that HWDSB will be recognizing this day with messages to schools and families. The International Day of Persons with Disabilities was started by the United Nations in 1992 and is a day to help everyone become more understanding of the challenges faced by people with disabilities and to recognize the benefits of including people with disabilities in everyday life.

Over the next few weeks, schools across HWDSB will be learning about Human Diversity, Human Rights, Ableism, Inclusion and Allyship. Your child's teacher will choose the topic which your class will learn more about.

# **HWDSB Bus Expectations- Reminders for our students that ride the bus!**

#### At the Bus Stop:

- 1. Students should be at their bus stop at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled pickup time.
- 2. While waiting for the bus, students must not run around on private property. We ask that students and families respectfully avoid waiting or walking across the lawns owned by residents near the bus stop.
- 3. When boarding the bus, remain in a single line and refrain from pushing.
- 4. No throwing or kicking snow at the bus stop

#### On the Bus:

- 1. Students should always remain seated, especially while the bus is in motion.
- 2. Obey the instructions of the school bus driver and/or educators on duty.
- 3. Refrain from eating or drinking on the bus for your own safety. Keep aisles clear.
- 4. Do not throw anything inside or out of the bus.
- 5. *JK/SK children must be accompanied by a parent/guardian when boarding and disembarking from the bus.* A bus tag must be clearly marked on the student's backpack with route number and home address. Please let us know in the office if you require a tag.

#### **Additional Rules:**

- 1. Students must ride on their <u>designated bus only</u>. The school does not have the authority to alter School Board designated bus assignments. Bus drivers carry a manifest of students on a specific route. **Students can only be tracked and insured when they are on their designated bus.**
- 2. The office must be notified in writing or via a phone call by 2:30 pm if a student who regularly rides the bus is to be picked up by a parent/guardian.

- 3. No offensive language, gestures, or negative conduct.
- 4. Failure to abide by these regulations may result in the suspension of bus privileges.

Finally, for your child's safety, please ensure there is adult supervision for your child at drop off and pick up times as there is no staff supervision at bus stops.

# Dental, vaccine and vision information as your child starts school

# Your child's teeth and **Healthy Smiles Ontario**

Good dental health for children leads to good overall health. Having healthy baby teeth can help them eat, talk, smile and learn in school. Brush your child's teeth twice a day, for at least 2 minutes. Use toothpaste with fluoride (size of a pea) to help reduce cavities.

## Are you unable to bring your child to the dentist because you cannot afford it?

Your child (0 to 17 years of age) may be able to get free dental care (HSO - Healthy Smiles Ontario) if:

- you have low income
- your child needs urgent dental care and you cannot pay for it

Your child (0 to 17 years of age) is automatically enrolled in Healthy Smiles Ontario if you receive:

- Ontario Works (OW)
- Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP)
- Temporary Care Assistance, or
- Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities (ACSD)

It is important for children to go to a dentist before they start school.

# Dental, vaccine and vision information as your child starts school

# Your child's eyes - How well can your child see?

Good eyesight is important for children to be able to play and learn. Your child may not tell you they have problems seeing. You may not notice your child is having problems with their eyes.



#### Free eye exam

It is important for children to have an eye exam before they start school. A full eye exam by an optometrist (eye doctor) is the best way to make sure your child can see well and that their eyes are healthy. An eye exam is free with an Ontario health card for children 19 years and younger.



#### Free glasses

Free glasses through the Eye See...Eye Learn program are available for children born in 2017 and 2018 that are in any Junior Kindergarten (Kindergarten - Year 1) or Senior Kindergarten (Kindergarten - Year 2) program. Book your child's eye exam with an optometrist who is part of the Eye See...Eye Learn program between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023.

#### Visit EyeSeeEyeLearn.ca to find an optometrist who is part of the program.
