BULLYING AWARNESS

- The school board is very committed to making schools a safe place.
- First Focus Positive Culture & Well Being Bullying happens EVERYWHERE!
- Define Bullying
 - o Bullying is aggressive and repeated behavior by a student towards another student.
 - This aggressive behavior occurs in context when a real threat is perceived within a power balance.
- Key Elements
 - o Intent to harm
 - o Power balance
 - o Repetition of aggressive threatening behavior
- What are the forms of bullying?
 - o Physical
 - o Verbal
 - Social
 - o Electronic Most difficult to control specifically if the student does not report it
- SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE!
 - o Bulllying MUST be reported
 - o The culture of 'snitches get stiches' MUST change

• How to know a child is being bullied?

- Not wanting to go to school
- Not participating in activities
- o Acting different
- Sudden loss of money
- o Talking about dropping out of school

How can parents help?

- o Talk openly
- Talk about feelings
- o Remind your child they have a RIGHT to be safe
- Be a partner with teachers
- o Report/talk to police

• How to help the child being bullied?

- REPORT IT TO THE SCHOOL
- o Instruct the child to walk away
- o Encourage child to talk to an adult they trust
- o Call kids help phone -- 1-800-668-6868
- o www.kidshelpphone.ca

• What can students do?

- Respect EVERYONE!
- o Don't join in
- o TELL AN ADULT
- Support fellow students Don't be a bystander
- o Talk to a trusted adult

How can parents prevent bullying?

- o Be a role model
- Monitor social media
- Seek help if you are concerned
- o Communicate with your child regarding their relationships
- Support school policies
- o GET HELP FROM SCHOOL

How do I know my child is a bully?

- o Coming home with new items that were not bought by you
- Aggressiveness
- o Manipulative
- o Constantly putting others down

• What to do?

- CONTACT THE SCHOOL
- o Take the problem seriously
- 57% of all bullying stops as soon as an adult intervenes
- School staff will immediately ask for the behavior to stop
- All teachers have a duty to report bullying
- The student that does the bullying will: get counselling and/or detention and/or expulsion and/or reported to the police
- The school CANNOT share the details of what happens to the 'bullier'

- ON FACEBOOK there is an app called HWDSB HELPS
- Students have been made aware of this app
- You simply log on and are able to leave anonymous tips
