The intent of the framework is to assist Student Success teams to support the needs of students in risk and ensure that student engagement and achievement are considered at all levels. Moving through the tiers involves increasing levels of intervention. The basic framework below is meant to highlight some of the strategies available to Student Success teams; you may consider adapting the framework to reflect the promotion and prevention strategies that are specific to your school setting.
