0.5 credit in civics

PLUS ONE CREDIT FROM EACH OF THE FOLLOWING GROUPS: <u>Group 1:</u> One additional credit in English, or French as a second language,** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education*** <u>Group 2:</u> One additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a second language,** or cooperative education*** <u>Group 3:</u> One additional credit in science (Grade 11 or 12), or technological education (Grades 9 – 12), or French as a second language,** or computer studies, or cooperative education***

In addition to the compulsory credits, students must complete 12 optional credits⁺, 40 hours of community involvement, and the provincial literacy requirement.

*A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

In groups 1, 2, & 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 & one from either group 2 or group 3. *A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

⁺The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.
