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Grad Checklist

- 30 credits (18 compulsory, 12 elective)
- 40 community involvement hours
- Successfully completed Literacy (OSSLT) requirement;
- If in French Immersion Program...completed 10 French Immersion Credits
- Post-Secondary program prerequisites
- If applying to university, you need a minimum of 6 Grade 12 U/M courses, including ENG4U1 and program prerequisites
- When applying to competitive college and university programs, watch for supplemental applications such as auditions, portfolios, essays etc.

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Grad Checklist-Community Hours

40 COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT HOURS NEEDED FOR ALL GRADS

- At the principal's discretion, the following activities will be deemed eligible for all secondary students for their community involvement activities:
- Activities that take place during the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day (e.g., walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school, helping younger siblings with their homework)
- Activities that include up to 10 hours of paid work, with the requirement to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to service for others (e.g., grocery work during the pandemic)
- Activities that consist of duties normally performed in the home (e.g., students could help an elderly relative with errands, provide after-school care for a sibling)





Online Graduation Requirement

- Two-credit online graduation requirement can be earned in the following ways:
 - selecting eLearning as a day school student at Westdale
 - Summer School
- Current Grade 11 students are credited with having earned one eLearning credit through remote learning during COVID-19 school closure

IMPORTANT

• Families can now opt out of the Ministry of Education's online learning graduation requirement. The "eLearning Opt Out for Families" form can be found in Parent Portal. There is currently no expiration date or deadline to submit

PATHWAYS

- Types of Grade 11 and 12 Courses:
 - College (C)
 - University (U)
 - College/University (M)
 - Workplace (E)
 - Open (O)





PATHWAYS

- Applied courses lead to College (C) and college/university (M) courses in Grade 11
- Academic courses lead to College/University (M) or University (U) courses in Grade 11
- Locally Developed courses lead to E (essential/workplace) level courses in Grade 11
- Pay close attention to admission requirements of postsecondary programs as some course selections may need to be revisited
- Set yourself up for success; no pathway is truly out of reach curiosity creativity creativity



 - Grade 12 English, C or U or equivalent
 - Grade 11 Mathematics, C, M or U level or equivalent (M or U level recommended)

Note: An additional requirement based on overall grades may be required to proceed into some of these programs.

 - Minimum of 6 Grade 12 4U or 4M courses, including ENG4U1
 - All programs have specific prerequisites
 - It is your responsibility to research your post secondary pathway and be aware of program prerequisites
 - DO IT NOW! Keep researching throughout the semester and into SUMMER!! It is your future!
 - COOPERATIVE EDUCATION and "OPEN" credits will NOT be used for your average for university admission



OYAP - Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

- Allows students to earn high school credits while participating in apprenticeship training in a skilled trade
- Full day co-op placement
- Semester 2 Accelerated OYAP opportunities available see your Guidance counsellor if interested
- Signed apprentice = Paid employment + 4 credits + apprenticeship hours earned towards certification





Accelerated OYAP

- Program that a Grade 12 student can participate in during semester 2 of their graduating year
- Student is registered as an apprentice
- Student can finish their Level 1 Apprenticeship Training at Mohawk College
- Student earns hours towards their apprenticeship
- After completing Accelerated OYAP, a student is ready to enter Level 2 of their apprenticeship

- Earn 2 credits in a half day coop placement all morning OR all afternoon in any semester (COO3OE)
- Earn 4 credits in a full day coop placement either semester 1 (COOFT1) OR in semester 2 (COOFT2)
- Requires application and interview
- <u>Central Coop Placements</u>
 - These are competitive placements that all HWDSB students can apply for
 - Hamilton Police Service, Cable 14, Hamilton Health Sciences, Art Gallery of Hamilton, ABLE Living, Crown Attorney's Office, Hamilton International Airport, Digital Canaries etc.
 - Require interview and additional application
- System Programs
 - ArtSmart, Building Careers from the Ground Up, Healthcare Support Services Program, Audition Based Program of the Arts at Glendale, Military Co-op, Ontario Public Service
 - Require interview and additional application

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Achieving SHSM

- FOUR Major Credits (at least one Gr. 11 and one Gr. 12)
- ONE Additional Credit as determined by SHSM
- Grade 12 English
- Some SHSM require Grade 12 math check with Guidance or SHSM teacher
- Certifications organized by SHSM teacher
- Experiential learning and Reach-ahead experiences
- TWO credits of co-op related to SHSM sector curiosity creativity

- Use summer school to
 - Get ahead in credits
 - Make up missed credits
 - Upgrade your foundational skills and upgrade your mark
- Summer school registration will be available April 1
