Grad Checklist

- 30 credits (18 compulsory, 12 elective)
- 40 community involvement hours
- Successfully completed Literacy (OSSLT) requirement;
- Online learning requirement
- If in French Immersion Program...completed 10 French Immersion Credits
- Post-Secondary program prerequisites
- If applying to university, you need a minimum of 6 Grade 12 U/M courses, including ENG4U1 and program prerequisites
- When applying to competitive college and university programs, watch for supplemental applications such as auditions, portfolios, essays etc.



Grad Checklist-Community Hours

- 40 COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT HOURS NEEDED FOR ALL GRADS
- At the principal's discretion, the following activities will be deemed eligible for all secondary students for their community involvement activities completed prior to June 2022:
 - Activities that take place during the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day (e.g., walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school, helping younger siblings with their homework)
- Activities that include up to 10 hours of paid work, with the requirement to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to service for others (e.g., grocery work during the pandemic)



Online Graduation Requirement

- Two-credit online graduation requirement can be earned in the following ways:
 - selecting eLearning as a day school student at Westdale
 - Summer School

IMPORTANT

• Families can now opt out of the Ministry of Education's online learning graduation requirement. The "eLearning Opt Out for Families" form can be found in Parent Portal. There is currently no expiration date or deadline to submit





- to the college representatives







Scholarships

Many Types...

- Automatic Entrance Scholarships based on marks and no application is required (no need to apply separately)
- Additional Scholarships are available but may require an application (e.g. TD Community Leaders, Loran Scholarship)
- Additional Scholarships are available but may require school nomination with your application (Queen's Chancellor's, Schulich Leader, Western National)
- Scholarship information is available on <u>ontariocolleges.ca</u>, <u>ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca</u>, and under the Scholarships and Awards tab on the Guidance Hub page
- Westdale subscribes to The Scholarship Report which is also found on the Guidance Hub page



Applying Outside Ontario/Canada

- Check each university website for deadlines and application fees as they vary from university to university
- Some schools outside of Ontario have a reciprocal agreement with OUAC to receive marks. Many do not. For schools that do not, students will either need to mail an official transcript or email an electronic transcript. Students need to know the process for each school they are applying to
- U.S. universities may require SAT or ACT scores, and most use The Common Application
- Information session in October at lunch (date for 2024 tbd)



Ontario Learn and Stay Grant

• Covers the cost of tuition, books, fees, direct educational costs

•Students must work in the region they studied for 6 months for every year they are funded by the grant

•Regions: Eastern Ontario (includes Ottawa, Kingston), Northern Ontario, Southwestern Ontario (includes London, Windsor)

• Eligible University Programs: Nursing BSN, Nursing MSc, Nursing Post-Graduate

•Eligible College Diploma Programs: Practical Nursing, Med Lab Tech, Paramedic



Student Accessibility Services

- Provided at each post-secondary school
- Offer a variety of academic supports
- Students accessing Learning Resource in high school and students with IEPs should explore Student Accessibility Services when touring post-secondary schools
- Post-secondary schools may request recent psychological assessment (assessment conducted during high school); refer to post-secondary school for additional information



OYAP - Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

•Allows students to earn high school credits while participating in apprenticeship training in a skilled trade

•Full day co-op placement

•Semester 2 Accelerated OYAP opportunities available - see your Guidance counsellor if interested

•Signed apprentice = Paid employment + 4 credits + apprenticeship hours earned towards certification



Accelerated OYAP

- Program that Grade 12 students can participate in during Semester 2 of their graduating year
- Student is registered as an apprentice
- Student can finish their Level 1 Apprenticeship training at Mohawk College
- Student earns hours towards their apprenticeship
- After completing Accelerated OYAP, a student is ready to enter Level 2 of their apprenticeship



Accelerated OYAP Programs (subject to change)

- Level 1 Automotive Service Technician
- Level 1 Cook
- Level 1 Child and Youth Worker
- Level 1 Early Childhood Educator
- Level 1 Hairstyling
- Level 1 General Carpenter



Cooperative Education (Coop)

- Earn 2 credits in a half-day placement (morning or afternoon) in any semester
- Earn 4 credits in a full-day placement in any semester
- Requires an application and interview
- Central Coop Placements
 - Competitive programs that all HWDSB students can apply for
 - Hamilton Police Service, Cable 14, Hamilton Health Sciences, etc.
 - Requires additional application and interview
- System Programs
 - ArtSmart, Building Careers from the Ground Up, Healthcare Support, etc
 - Requires an additional application and interivew
