


We respect the longstanding relationships with the local Indigenous communities, the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the Six Nations of the Grand River.






Grad Checklist

- 30 credits (18 compulsory, 12 elective);
- 40 community involvement hours;
- Successfully completed Literacy Requirement;
- Online Graduation Requirement; 2 credits or Opt Out;
- If in French Immersion Program...completed 10 French Immersion Credits
- Post-Secondary program prerequisites
- If applying to university, students need a minimum of 6 Grade 12 U/M courses, including ENG4U1 and program prerequisites
- When applying to competitive college and university programs, watch for supplemental applications such as auditions, portfolios, essays etc.

Grad Checklist- Community Hours

- 40 COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT HOURS NEEDED FOR JUNE 2026 GRADS
- Policies and processes for Community Involvement Hours have returned to pre-COVID-19 practices
- Please submit Community Involvement Hours by April 1 so that hours are complete before Semester 2 midterm data transfers to OUAC and OCAS

Ineligible Activities

- Any duty/services that would normally be performed for wages in a workplace;
- Requirement for a class, course, or program;
- Takes place during class instructional time;

Online Graduation Requirement

- Two-credit online graduation requirement can be earned in the following ways:
 - selecting eLearning as a day school student at Westdale
 - summer school eLearning

<u>OR</u>

 Families can now opt out of the Ministry of Education's online learning graduation requirement. The "eLearning Opt Out for Families" form can be found in Parent Portal.
 There is currently no expiration date or deadline to submit

- Ontario College Fair October 16-17
- Westdale College Fair October 21
- Post-Secondary Fall Preview Days (Open Houses) begin

Overview of Grade 12 Year

November:

- Students with interest in particular schools or programs should be completing applications:
 - Any program at University of Toronto
 - Students applying to Major Admission Awards at Queen's University
 - · Students applying to college programs in nursing, paramedic, dental hygiene

December:

- Recommended time for OUAC and OCAS applications to be complete
 January
- OUAC applications due mid-January
- OCAS applications due end of January

Overview of Grade 12 Year

February:

- Commencement information communicated to Grade 12 students and families April:
- Recommended completion date for Community Involvement Hours
 May
- Deadline for student to accept offer from Ontario Colleges (usually May 1)
- University offers continue until late May

June

- Deadline for students to accept offer from Ontario Universities (often June 1)
- Students may apply to OSAP after confirming acceptance to post-secondary program


University Prerequisites

- Top 6 Grade 12 U/M courses including ENG4U + specific program prerequisite courses
- Some university programs limit the number of 'M' level courses you can have in your top 6
 - e.g. McMaster Nursing Degree Program
 ENG4U, (1 of MHF4U, MCV4U, MDM4U), SBI4U, SCH4U
 + 2 other 4U/4M courses
- Co-op, college and open level courses DO NOT count towards your university admission average
- Use <u>ouinfo.ca</u> to research admission requirements for programs

Mandatory supplementary application due January 30, 2025 (noon ET). Applicants will be provided with details.

OUAC application deadline: January 15, 2025.

If you have a strong admission average, you may qualify for free choice of discipline in Level II.

Language Requirements

You are **not** required to submit an English-language test if you:

- resided in an English-speaking country for at least 4 years immediately prior to September 2024 or
- attended an English-speaking educational institution in a full-time academic (non-ESL) program for at least 4 years immediately prior to September 2025. Official documentation from the school is required for this exemption.

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Application Strategies For University

Advice from one post-secondary representative:

- 1) Check to be sure that programs and/or schools align (e.g. make sure student has more than one option for first choice of program).
- 2) Consider applying to one school outside of the GTHA.
- 3) As best as possible, apply to one program where you are <u>very confident</u> you will receive an offer of admission.
- 4) Consider applying by December 1; add more programs before the application deadline as necessary.



College

Reseach programs at ontariocolleges.ca

- Colleges offer students many different program types:
 - Certificate (often one year, but length of program varies)
 - · e.g. Preparatory Studies, Skilled Trades Techniques, CICE
 - Diploma (usually four semesters in length)
 - Workforce readiness (e.g. Paramedic, Technician)
 - Advanced Diploma (usually at least six semesters)
 - Workforce readiness PLUS additional theory and skills
 - Bachelor Degree (four years)
 - · e.g. BSc Nursing, Bachelor of Interior Design, Bachelor of Digital Health

Domestic and International student admission requirements

- OSSD or equivalent (Mohawk Academic Upgrading, GED) including:
 - Grade 12 English, C or U or equivalent
 - Grade 12 Mathematics, MAP4C ≥ 60%; or MCT4C; or any U or equivalent

Language Requirements for Applicants with English as a Second Language


- See below for accepted equivalents for Grade 12 English:
 - Successful completion of the <u>GAS-English for Academic</u> <u>Purposes (478)</u> program
 - <u>TOEFL</u> minimum score of 560 (83 Internet based)
 - or <u>IELTS</u> Academic minimum score of 6.5 overall with no band less than 6.0

College Pathway Planning

- College diploma may lead directly to work
- Students interested in skilled trades, but who do not have prior experience or an employer sponsor can apply to college and pursue an apprenticeship after college
- Students earning a college diploma or advanced diploma can pursue a university degree (or bachelor's degree) after earning their diploma. Some colleges and universities have articulation agreements where students can complete their degree after earning their diploma



Dual Credits

• The HWDSB has a partnership with Mohawk College where students can earn credits that count toward their high school OSSD and college. Many of these programs are offered at the Mohawk campus or elsewhere in the community.

Here is a sample of this year's offerings:

- Positive Psychology & Movies, Identity and Culture
- Community Services Intro to Social Work & Rec Therapy
- Developmental Psychology & Health and Wellness
- Computer Technology HTML and CSS & Hardware/Software
- Graphic Design
- Aviation Technology (located at Hamilton Airport)
- Welding (located at Stoney Creek campus)



Apprenticeship

What is an apprenticeship?

- As an apprentice, you learn a skilled trade on the job. You work with and learn from experienced workers – and get paid while you do it.
- You also learn in a classroom from instructors who know the skilled trade. This may take place in high school, on a college campus or a union training centre.
- Canada has a large demand for workers in the skilled trades and technologies. There are 144 skilled trades in Ontario!

Apprenticeships: How to get started

- Take courses in Technologies (or other areas leading to your chosen skilled trade) to develop skills that apply to skilled trades
- Take co-op courses to test out career pathways, gain real-world experience and form relationships with potential employers
- Leverage co-op experience and relationships to explore an apprenticeship opportunity OR apply to a college program where you will develop skills and be connected with an employer

Comparing Pathways to Apprenticeship

Direct Entry to Apprenticeship

As an apprentice, you learn a skilled trade on the job in combination with class training

VS

Apprenticeships are completed in 3-5 years

VS

Pre- Apprenticeship College Program

The college courses may be 1 or 2 year programs. The courses are designed to deliver the skills enabling persons enter a skilled trade.

After completing a college program, the students begin the apprenticeship process.

Post-secondary trades options

Option 1: Find an employer to sponsor you as an apprentice.

- Traditional apprenticeship
- Trade union or group sponsor

Option 2: Complete a college course in a skilled trade of interest.

- Pre-apprenticeship
- College diploma or certificate



ONTARIO YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

- Start chosen career and train as a registered apprentice while enrolled in high school
- On-the-job training for students who like to learn by DOING
- Signed apprentice = Paid employment + 4 credits + apprenticeship hours
- Well-paying, in-demand jobs with benefits
- Research how opportunities at Westdale AND co-op can help you get started
- A good start is to select Tech course(s) and co-op in Grade 11

Pursuing a SHSM enables students to ...

- 1. Customize their secondary school education to suit interests and talents;
- 2.Develop specialized knowledge and skills that are valued by the sector or post-secondary education institutions;
- 3.Earn credits that are recognized by the sector and post-secondary education institution;
- 4. Gain sector-specific and career-relevant certification and training;
- 5.Identify, explore, and refine career goals and make informed decisions about their post-secondary destination;
- 6.Remain flexible, with the option to shift between pathways should their goals and plans change;

How can students achieve SHSM?

- √ FOUR Major Credits (at least one Gr. 11 and one Gr. 12)
- ✓ ONE Additional Credit as determined by SHSM.
- ✓ Grade 12 English
- ✓ Some SHSM require Grade 12 math check with Guidance or SHSM teacher
- ✓ Certifications organized by SHSM teacher
- ✓ Reach-ahead experience
- ✓ Experiential learning
- ✓ TWO credits of co-op. Your placement must be related to your SHSM sector

Scholarships

Many Types...

- Automatic Entrance Scholarships based on marks and no application is required (no need to apply separately)
- Additional Scholarships are available but may require an application (e.g. TD Community Leaders, Loran)
- Additional Scholarships are available but may require school nomination with your application (U of T National, Queen's Chancellor's, Schulich Leader, Western National)
- Scholarship information is available on <u>ontariocolleges.ca</u>, <u>ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca</u>, and under the Scholarships and Awards tab on the Guidance Hub page
- Students should read The Scholarship Report on the Guidance Hub page for information about Community Scholarships and planning during Grade 12

OSAP (Ontario Student Assistance Program)

- OSAP applications will open in the spring (<u>OSAP: Ontario Student Assistance Program | ontario.ca</u>)
- Cannot apply for OSAP until you have accepted an offer to a post-secondary institution
- Can be used at institutions throughout Canada and outside of Canada as well; there
 is a list of eligible institutions on the OSAP website
- Combination of grants (non-repayable) and loans (repayable)
- Check eligibility requirements before applying
- Check the estimator to get an idea of amount (<u>OSAP Aid Estimator for Full-Time</u> <u>Students: Home Page (gov.on.ca)</u>)

Learn and Stay Grant

- Ontario Learn and Stay Grant | ontario.ca
- Funding for students studying in priority regions in Ontario (Northern, Southwestern and Eastern) in eligible college and university programs
- Students must commit to working 6 months/year of their program in the region where they studied; failure to meet obligation will turn the grant into a repayable OSAP loan
- College programs Practical Nursing, Paramedic, Medical Lab Technology
- University Programs Nursing
- Covers tuition, books, compulsory fees, direct educational costs
- Applications open in the spring

- Students register for Summer School through myBlueprint.
- Most summer school courses begin July 2. Co-op courses include in-person learning in the spring
- Credit Recovery available for many Grade 9 and 10 credits
