





Grad Checklist

- 30 credits (18 compulsory, 12 elective)
- 40 community involvement hours; due by April 1, 2026
- Successfully completed Literacy Requirement;
- Online Graduation Requirement; 2 credits or Opt Out
- If in French Immersion Program...completed 10 French Immersion Credits
- Post-Secondary program admission requirements
- If applying to university, you need a minimum of 6 Grade 12 U/M courses, including ENG4U1 and program prerequisites
- When applying to competitive college and university programs, watch for supplemental applications such as auditions, portfolios, essays etc.



Grad Checklist- Community Hours

- 40 COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT HOURS NEEDED FOR JUNE 2026 GRADS
- Please submit Community Involvement Hours by April 1 so that hours are complete before
 Semester 2 midterm data transfers to OUAC and OCAS

Ineligible Activities

- Any duty/services that would normally be performed for wages in a workplace;
- Requirement for a class, course, or program;
- Takes place during class instructional time



Online Graduation Requirement

- Two-credit online graduation requirement can be earned in the following ways:
 - selecting eLearning as a day school student at Westdale
 - summer school eLearning

<u>OR</u>

• Families can now opt out of the Ministry of Education's online learning graduation requirement. The "eLearning Opt Out for Families" form can be found in Parent Portal. There is currently no expiration date or deadline to submit.

College

- Colleges offer students many different program types:
 - Certificate (often one year, but length of program varies)
 - e.g. Preparatory Studies, Skilled Trades Techniques, CICE
 - Diploma (usually four semesters in length)
 - Workforce readiness (e.g. Paramedic, Technician)
 - Advanced Diploma (usually at least six semesters)
 - Workforce readiness PLUS additional theory and skills
 - Bachelor Degree (four years)
 - e.g. BSc Nursing, Bachelor of Interior Design, Bachelor of Digital Health



Ontario College Application Process

- Do research and apply online at <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u> starting in early October
- Obtain OEN (Ontario Education Number) from any report card or in a student's myBlueprint profile
- Instructional videos will be posted on the Guidance Hub page under "applying to college and university"
- Equal Consideration Deadline to apply to college is February 1, 2026
- \$150.00 application fee
- 5 choices—no more than 3 programs at any one college



Ontario College Application Timelines

- Application opens October 10
- Apply by February 1 for equal consideration
- Applications after February 1 will be processed only if there is space in the program
- Applications open early October
- November 1 is the earliest date you will receive an offer of acceptance to an Ontario College Program
- We encourage students applying to highly competitive programs (e.g. practical nursing, dental hygiene, paramedic) to apply by end of October
- Offers continue to go out until programs are filled; then waitlisted
- Deadline to accept offer is May 1
- Westdale Guidance will conduct College Application support sessions in October

- Choices 1,2,3 are for the program most interested in by the student
- Choices 4 and 5 allow for a pathway to program if not accepted into Practical Nursing.
- (*) represents a school and program that qualifies for the Learn and Stay Grant



Application Tips

- Be sure to check the program start date (Sept 2026 vs Jan 2027)
- Use all 5 choices
- Consider one school outside the GTHA for competitive programs
- Keep track of your logins and passwords; use a personal email account
- Be sure that your program choices are entered in order of preference
- Westdale Guidance will conduct a "How to Apply to College" information session in October TBD

APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY

- Use <u>www.ouinfo.ca</u> to research
- Use <u>www.ouac.on.ca</u> to apply to Ontario universities
- OUAC=Ontario Universities Application Centre
- Students will apply to an undergraduate degree program at University where you earn a Bachelor's Degree (i.e. Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science)
- Most undergraduate degree programs are four years in length



University Prerequisites

- Top 6 Grade 12 U/M courses including ENG4U + specific program prerequisite courses
- Some university programs limit the number of 'M' level courses you can have in your top 6
 - e.g. McMaster Nursing Degree Program
 ENG4U, (1 of MHF4U, MCV4U, MDM4U), SBI4U, SCH4U
 + 2 other 4U/4M courses
- Co-op, college and open level courses DO NOT count towards your university admission average



OUAC Key Dates

- OUAC Platform opens for applications in late September
- January 15, 2026 deadline to apply
- May 28, 2026 latest date student may receive an offer from an Ontario University
- June 1, 2026 deadline to respond to offers of admission
- Westdale Guidance will conduct an information session on Wednesday, October 1 during Period 3 in the Auditorium for students applying to university



Ontario University Application Process www.ouac.on.ca

- OUAC fee is \$156 for 3 choices
- \$50 for each additional choice beyond the first 3
- \$10 fee if you are not a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Some schools have supplemental fees:
 - Guelph Landscape Architecture \$60
 - McMaster Engineering \$50, Health Sciences \$30
 - U of T Architecture \$100, Commerce \$51, Computer Science \$51, Engineering \$43.86, Medical Radiation Sciences \$50, Music \$70
 - Waterloo Architecture \$60, Engineering \$60
 - York (some programs in School of Arts, Media, Performance & Design) \$25
- Supplemental fees will be paid to OUAC at the time of application. All fees are non-refundable



How do colleges and universities get my marks?

- All Grade 11 and 12 marks are sent electronically by the HWDSB in November, February, April and July.
- Check your OCAS/OUAC account online after every reporting period and let your counsellor know about any errors – students will get an email alert when their profile is updated



Repeated Courses

- Repeated mark policy varies from school to school
 - Some take the mark from the first attempt at the course
 - Some take the highest mark
 - Some take an average
 - Some give a penalty
- Students should check the minimum average and the repeated course policy for your university program of choice

Student Information on OUAC Application

- You must provide information about ALL institutions where you have registered in 1 or more high school courses.
 Institutions may include but are not limited to:
 - Westdale Secondary School
 - Previous high school attended
 - HWDSB summer school eLearning
 - Out-of-Board summer school
 - Private School
 - Ontario Virtual School
- You DO NOT need to include institutions where your home school registered you for courses (e.g. board virtual school, dual credit, SHSM, consortium eLearning)
- It is YOUR responsibility to ensure that Guidance is aware that you are taking that course so it may be added to your historical grades







Trend: Students Seem to be Sticking Closer to Home










Application Strategies

Advice from one post-secondary representative:

- 1) Check to be sure that programs and/or schools align (e.g. make sure student has more than one option for first choice of program).
- 2) Consider applying to one school outside of the GTHA.
- 3) As best as possible, apply to one program where you are <u>very confident</u> you will receive an offer of admission.
- 4) Consider applying by December 1; add more programs before the January 15 application deadline as necessary.



Sample Student 1: BSc Nursing

- Nursing programs are in high demand provincially and the number of applications exceeds the number of seats available in programs
- NOTE: If you apply to Mohawk BSc Nursing, must apply in OUAC as a second choice at McMaster
- If nursing is your goal, always choose a school outside the GTHA
- * Learn and Stay Grant eligible

- Offers to McMaster Health Science are based on a combined score of admission average and Supplemental application score.
- At least one choice needs to be a school where you know you will exceed the cut off average for the program.

- McMaster is a common first year Engineering program while Guelph requires students to apply for the specific discipline they are interested in
- McMaster also requires a supplemental application for Engineering I
- Choices 2 and 3 are not Engineering programs but allow a student to remain local while studying in a similar field

Universities Outside of Ontario

- Check each university website for deadlines and application fees as they vary from university to university.
- Some schools outside of Ontario have a reciprocal agreement with OUAC to receive marks. Many do not. For schools that do not, students will either need to mail an official transcript or email an electronic transcript. Students need to know the process for each school they are applying to.
- U.S. universities may require SAT or ACT scores, and most use The Common Application.

OUAC Reciprocal Agreements

- If you apply to any school listed on the previous slide, you can authorize that school to request your academic information from OUAC
- There will be space on each school's application for you to enter your OUAC
 Reference Number
- Your Reference Number will be 2026-XXXXXXX and it is generated AFTER you submit your OUAC application
- Some schools ask for your Reference Number in the format above. Other schools want it in the format 2025XXXXXXX0 (no dash and an 11th number which is ALWAYS zero)
- For this reason, we always recommend completing the OUAC application first

Scholarships

Many Types...

- Automatic Entrance Scholarships based on marks and no application is required (no need to apply separately)
- Additional Scholarships are available but may require an application (e.g. TD Community Leaders, Loran, U of T Wolf Scholars)
- Additional Scholarships are available but may require school nomination with your application (U of T National, Queen's Chancellor's, Schulich Leader, Western National)
- Scholarship information is available on <u>ontariocolleges.ca</u>, <u>ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca</u>, and under the Scholarships and Awards tab on the Guidance Hub page
- Westdale subscribes to The Scholarship Report, a quarterly publication. Access is through the Guidance Course in The Hub or through our newsletter.



Queen's Major Admission Awards

Chancellor's Scholarship

Westdale can nominate two students for this award

Melvin R Goodes Scholarship

- Any number of Westdale students can apply
- Must also complete the Financial Needs Bursary application on the SOLUS website

Deadlines to be aware of:

- November 13 information session for students at lunch
- November 20 deadline to apply to Queen's through OUAC
- November 24 Westdale deadline for Chancellor's consideration
- December 8 MAA application due on SOLUS



OSAP (Ontario Student Assistance Program)

- OSAP applications will open in the spring (<u>OSAP: Ontario Student Assistance Program</u> <u>I ontario.ca</u>)
- Cannot apply for OSAP until you have accepted an offer to a post-secondary institution
- Can be used at institutions throughout Canada and outside of Canada as well; there is a list of eligible institutions on the OSAP website
- Combination of grants (non-repayable) and loans (repayable)
- Check eligibility requirements before applying
- Check the estimator to get an idea of amount (<u>OSAP Aid Estimator for Full-Time</u> <u>Students: Home Page (gov.on.ca)</u>)



Learn and Stay Grant

- Ontario Learn and Stay Grant | ontario.ca
- Funding for students studying in priority regions in Ontario (Northern, Southwestern and Eastern) in eligible college and university programs
- Students must commit to working 6 months/year of their program in the region where they studied; failure to meet obligation will turn the grant into a repayable OSAP loan
- College programs Practical Nursing, Paramedic, Medical Lab Technology
- University Programs Nursing
- Covers tuition, books, compulsory fees, direct educational costs
- Applications open in the spring



Returning to Westdale

- Most students wishing to return to Westdale may do so for one semester only; must be a full – time student in that semester (minimum of 3 classes)
- Students with an IEP are eligible to return for a full year
- Other students may be eligible to return for a full year under certain circumstances



Deferring an Offer to University

- You may be eligible to request a deferral of up to one year after being admitted to a university
- The rules for deferring varies between schools; almost always the student may not complete any education during the deferral year (at high school or post-secondary)
- You must check the rules at each school of interest



International Student – Literacy Requirement

It is your responsibility to make all arrangements regarding the writing of English Language Proficiency tests and to have the official score report forwarded to the Admissions Office directly from the testing centre by April 1st!

You are **not** required to submit an English-language test if you:

- resided in an English-speaking country for at least 4 years immediately prior to September 2025 and have no ESL classes

 OR
- attended an English-speaking educational institution in a full-time academic (non-ESL) program for at least 4 years immediately prior to September 2026.

International Student – Provincial Attestation Letter

- Once you have accepted an offer of admission then you need to make arrangements to obtain your Provincial Attestation Letter directly from the university you will be attending
- Your PAL will be granted specifically for the university you will be attending and for the program you have accepted the offer to
- If your study permit is about to expire for high school, then you need to apply to extend it through to June 2026 so that you can graduate

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I take a study period?

 New this year – Waterloo has relaxed their policy for Engineering admissions and students may now take a spare (or two) and not be penalized in the application process

Can I do an early application?

There is no official 'early application' period in Ontario. OUAC opens in late September and are due by January 15. U of T, to our knowledge, is the only school that publishes an 'Early Application Deadline' in Ontario.

Can I get early admission?

- Early offers of admission vary from school to school. Some schools send early offers to highly qualified applicants while other schools wait until more Grade 12 marks are available before beginning to send offers. By and large, schools in Ontario send offers in numerous rounds, and the number of rounds each school does depends on the school
