

# **eLearning**

- Westmount is a unique self-directed, self-paced program that is structured around face-to-face learning.
- We highly recommend that students take in person classes in grade
   9 to build a strong foundation for their learning at Westmount
- Students wishing to take a full timetable of eLearning, should register with their home school.

# How Westmount is different from other schools:




Self-Direction: choice of project, choice of evaluation, choice of learning environment as negotiated with teachers

**Self-Pacing:** fast track classes, work to your strengths, complete courses early

Self-Pacing: take time to master learning, write tests when you are ready, organize time according to needs

# **How Might Students Self-Pace?**

Work to their strengths by working faster in some subjects

Take more time to be successful in a subject they find challenging

Participate in intentional collaboration with teachers and parents/caregivers



**Learning Commons:** Technical Support, Resource Support, Teacher Support, and Collaborative space.

Self-Directed Learning Days (SDL) and Sign-outs: Students can direct their learning to alternate settings. SDL Days provide opportunities for students to focus their learning how and where they see fit.

# **Supports in Self-Direction and Self-Pacing**

Advisor Program: Assists in academic and pathways planning, wellness strategies and goal-setting

Fast-Tracking and Carryovers: Students can accelerate their learning and complete credits early. Students may negotiate with the teacher to continue a course in the next semester

### How else is Westmount different from other schools?

 Westmount welcomes grade 9 students from more than 60 different elementary schools, which contributes to the unique character of our school community.






A unique *system* program that supports student ownership of their learning

# Specialist High Skills Major (SHSMs)

Beginning in grade 11, students can start to focus their learning in a specific economic sector. Westmount offers six Specialist High Skills Major programs – among the most of all secondary schools.



# **Advanced Placement (AP)**

• In Grade 11 and 12, students can take Advance Placement (AP) courses in English, Math and Senior Sciences.

# **Other In-School Supports**



Support	Benefit
Breakfast Club	Provides daily morning nutritious 'grab-and-go' snacks
Social Work Support	To remove barriers for regular attendance and academic success
Literacy/Numeracy Club	Lunch time/After school, teacher-supported tutoring in literacy and numeracy for grades 9 and 10 courses
MHAN Support	Confidential mental health supports to promote wellness—by referral
Prayer Space	Provided for daily and Friday prayers
5 Period Day	Provides a longer lunch period and provides time for intramural sports and extracurriculars
Bell Times: 8:40 - 3:15	Later start supports morning practices, extracurriculars and travel times



# Factors to Consider Before Applying

- Learning skills and autonomy
- Full-time eLearning
  - not an option for Westmount Students
- Westmount does not provide:
  - Specialized ESL Support for MLLs
  - Individualized supports such as Educational Assistants, Grad Coaches or CYCP
  - Transportation

Students who have been educated via home school or in an alternate setting will be called in for an interview

Final offers will be made and caregivers will confirm offer and ensure registration package is complete

# How to Become a Westmount Wildcat?

Date	Action
November 26, 2025	Grade 7 & 8 Information Night - 6:00 pm Notice of Intent online form available on Registration Tab of website starting Nov. 27, 2025.
December 19, 2025	Final date for Notice of Intent to Attend due by 1pm. Attach Grade 7 final report card and most recent Grade 8 report card. Late applicants will be waitlisted.
Mid-January 2026	Parents informed about acceptance via email.
February 5, 2026	Grade 8 Parent Course Selection Night – Details communicated with acceptance
February 2026	HWDSB students will have entered their course selections in My BluePrint with their grade 8 class by this date. All students will be given a Microsoft Form option sheet that they will submit before Feb. 13, 2026. Non-HWDSB students will be given a separate registration and course option package.
Mid-March, 2026	Starting mid-March 2026, HWDSB parents/guardians confirm course selection via Parent Portal.

Registered Westmount students will be invited for a morning of activities that will allow students to get to know their peers

# Late August 2026 – Grade 9 Orientation Program (Date TBD)

Westmount traditionally hosts a fun day to meet other students and support progress into the self-directed, self-paced school environment. More details to come; registration occurs in the spring.


