## NEW END OF DAY PROCEDURE

Please be aware of the new end of day procedure at W.H. Ballard. Students are asked to kindly exit the school grounds promptly at 3:10 pm. A supervising educator is on duty on the back playground between 3:10 and 3:25 pm. During this time, all students must exit the school grounds for legal purposes. Students are invited to re-enter the school grounds after 3:25 when the school day has officially ended and supervision has concluded. It is important during this transition to speak to your child regarding "street safety" as we are a high traffic area especially during dismissal time. Students are asked to please not play with balls or block exits during this time in order to keep everyone safe. Please have a meaningful discussion with your children regarding this procedure.

## PICKING UP YOUR CHILD EARLY???

The office is a very busy place, especially close to the end of the day so we ask that parents please follow these steps to ensure a smooth pick up.

**Please note that we do not call students down before a parent arrives as we have no place for them to be supervised while waiting.**

1. Use School Messenger, send a note with your child or call the office to give us advanced notice that your student will be leaving early. This makes the teacher aware so that the student can be prepared when they are called down when you arrive. Especially if they are not in their classroom.
2. Please plan ahead. Give yourself enough time and remember that it can take a bit of time to locate your student and have them get ready. Especially in the winter, it can take a bit of time for the students to get all of their gear on.
3. Please avoid picking up students during nutrition breaks. We have no way of reaching students who may be outside at that time. We don't want to keep you waiting longer than necessary.
4. Please make sure that your contact / pick up list is up to date. In case of an emergency or in the event that the person picking up your child is not on their pick up list, we will be calling parents to verify. If you are sending someone that is not on your list, please notify the office. Individuals picking up may be asked to provide identification before a student is released to them.

**ENTERING THE SCHOOL?** In an effort to maintain a safe environment for our students, **Visitors to our building must be buzzed in and check in at the office for direction.** Parents are not permitted to move freely about the building or walk students to class unless given permission by school staff. We thank you for your cooperation.

**LOOKING TO VOLUNTEER?** Should you be interested in volunteering with us, please remember to make sure that you have a Vulnerable Sector Police Screening (must have been issued within the last six months) completed and have filled out volunteer information forms. Once the forms have been filled out, you will be invited to have an interview with Mr. Shearer our Vice-Principal. Forms are available at the office.
