Dear Families,

Thank you for your patience as we move through these difficult times. The situation continues to evolve, and our commitment is to keep you informed. Our intention is to touch base with you on a weekly basis with updates and further information.

This week, the Ontario government extended the Declaration of Emergency until May 12, on the advice of the Chief Medical Officer of Health and with the approval of the Ontario legislature. We continue to wait for the official notification from the Ministry of Education regarding a school closure extension. We remain committed to our plan, *Caring in the face of challenge: learning and support during COVID-19*.

### **Deployment of Student Devices**

This week, staff supported our unprecedented distribution of technology, so that all students can participate in distance learning. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to all staff supporting this successful implementation.

Approximately 6,000 school devices were deployed to students this week with approximately 1,000 more internet-enabled devices to be deployed next week. We are prepared if the demand increases over time, as family situations might change. Many of these are assistive devices essential for students receiving special education supports.

If you need a device or if your situation has changed, please contact your child's school.

### **Supporting Learning at Home**

As we continue in this new phase of learning at home, some students have unique learning needs when it comes to planning and organizational skills, including the ability to develop and follow a routine, to break down more complex tasks and to complete their work. These difficulties may increase when learning from home, as the normal supports, environment and routines of the classroom have changed. To help parents with strategies to support this learning at home, Specialized Services has developed a new resource: Help your child learning at a distance: tips for parents.

As always, families should connect with their child's teacher about specific lessons and additional supports required.

### **Cancellations**

We regret to inform you of another decision we have had to make about cancellations. All athletics, proms, banquets and similar events are cancelled for the remainder of the school year. We will

communicate early next week regarding June graduation ceremonies, including elementary school celebrations. We know how significant these milestones are for students and families. We are exploring other options and awaiting further updates from the province before finalizing our decision.

### **School Construction**

As you may know, Ontario's announcement about essential services deemed some construction work essential. However, construction work for schools does not fall into the essential service category. This means that the following HWDSB projects have been paused due to COVID-19:

### New builds on pause

- Greensville New elementary school
- Rockton New elementary school
- Memorial (Stoney Creek) New elementary school
- School on the Glen Campus

  New elementary school
- Spring Valley New elementary school
- Nora Frances Henderson New secondary school

### Renovations on pause

- Ancaster High Window replacement and two elevator installations
- Glendale Renovations of science labs
- W.H. Ballard Playground paving
- Saltfleet Natural turf field and track
- Sir Allan MacNab Elevator installation and accessibility

Some work may occur on these sites, as general contractors make them safe during the pause. Despite the pause, we continue to be on track with our new school openings and construction renovation projects. However, if this does change due to the duration of the pause, we will provide an update to our communities next month.

### **Maintaining School Facilities**

All HWDSB schools will continue to receive regular security checks, inspections, maintenance and, when necessary, deep cleaning. We want to ensure that they remain in a state of good repair and available for students when we reopen. HWDSB takes its lead from Hamilton Public Health Services and should the public health department advise the school board to take any additional precautions, we will implement them immediately.

### **COVID-19 Relief Fund**

<u>Hamilton Food Share</u> continues to respond to the rapidly evolving situation in the city as a result of COVID-19. Hamilton Food Share is an emergency food bank hub that supplies healthy food to 12 food banks and hot meal programs across Hamilton.
