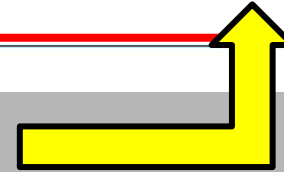

The ASD/DD Social Communication Summer Camp Learning Program aims to support in-school transitions, skill development, and a range of strategies and interventions to promote social communication, self-regulation, and life planning skills for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder or a Developmental Disability. Evidence-based best practices will be utilized as the foundation for the planning and delivery of the program, including applied behaviour analytic (ABA) strategies. Individual learning programs will be carefully planned, implemented and evaluated to maximize fun and engaging opportunities for participants. The program will be delivered by an interdisciplinary team of Teachers, Educational Assistants, Child and Youth Care Practitioners, Speech-Language Pathologists, and Board Certified Behaviour Analysts.
