


## Reading Scores Continue To Climb During Obstacle-Filled School Year

Reading achievement continues to trend upwards and we are seeing a narrowing of the gap for students attending High Priority Schools. For the first time in recent years, more than **75 per cent** of HWDSB students in Grades 4 to 6 were reading at the provincial standard (Level 3 or B-) at the end of the first term.
