The Right to Survival - all children have the right to a happy and healthy life, nutritious food, clean water, clean air and a clean environment.







The Right to Protection - all children have the right to be safe from all types of harm. No one can hurt you, touch in an uncomfortable way, or bully you, even if it is on the internet. Not even people you know can hurt you.







The Right to Participation – all children have the right to be involved in activities, share their opinions on issues that affect them, right to have a name and a right to a nationality.







The Right to Development – all children have the right to go to school, and the right to play.







Time to Draw or Write

I Have the Right to Play - Draw and/or write about yourself playing.



I Have the Right to Survival - Draw and/or write about yourself eating nutritious food, drinking clean water.

I Have the Right to Protection - Draw and/or write about yourself talking to someone who you trust, who makes you feel safe.

I Have the Right to Participation - Draw and/or write about your thoughts and ideas on issues that affect you - meaning of your name, nationality, or your ancestral home
