On behalf of the First Nations, Metis, Inuit Community Advisory Committee (FNMI), the Indigenous Education Team at HWDSB, and Cultivating Community: Reclaiming Our Spaces in Education (CC:ROSE), the Indigenous Student Community at HWDSB, we are excited to share more information on the newly approved Indigenous Student Trustee position on the HWDSB Board of Trustees.

The Indigenous Student Trustee position, otherwise known as Shakowennakará:tats ([they] raises the voices of the family/community), is a designated seat for a grade 11-12 self-identified Indigenous learner. Designates must also be enrolled in a full-time course load during the duration of the 2022-2023 school year.

The purpose and intent of the Indigenous Student Trustee, Shakowennakará:tats, is to raise the voices of the family and/or community, and within this context, it is the Indigenous Student Community, otherwise known as CC:ROSE (please see CC:ROSE Expression of Interest Form for more information). Thus, designates must be an active participant of CC:ROSE. Selection by Indigenous students involved in CC:ROSE will take place on/before February 25, 2022.

Indigenous Learners at HWDSB now have two options:

- 1. To run for a Student Trustee election, following the Student Trustee Application process
- 2. Selection by Indigenous students involved with CC: ROSE that will take place on/before February 25th, 2022 for the Indigenous specific Student Trustee position

When all Student Trustees have been identified, a final Board report will be submitted to the Board of Trustees for ratification in March 2022.

The new Student Trustees will be asked to attend the **Ontario Student Trustees' Association Conference** in **May 2021** along with the outgoing Student Trustees.

Student Trustee Role:

Please note that Student Trustees attend weekly meetings with the Board of Trustees on Monday nights from September to June. The length of time for these meetings vary, but generally start at 5 pm and end at 10 pm. Student Trustees also plan and attend monthly meetings for Student Senate and those meetings are generally held after school. Additionally, the Student Trustees are often asked to represent the student voice at special community events and provincial student conferences, and to be involved in select Board activities.
