The History of IB and IB in Ontario

- The International Baccalaureate was founded in Geneva, Switzerland in 1968 as a non-profit educational foundation
- There are 5548 IB schools (PYP, MYP, DP, Career Program) in 160 countries
- The Americas account for over 46% of the IB schools worldwide
- 377 IB World Schools in Canada: 184 in the DP
- First Canadian School in 1974
- IB Diploma Pass Rates (2022): World Average 86.11%, Westdale 100% (10/10), Ancaster 100% (11/11)
- Over 1.5 million students have graduated from DP worldwide
- ~1600 Universities in Canada and USA recognize the IB Programme






IB in the HWDSB

- Two Schools offer the IB Diploma Programme:
 - Ancaster Secondary School
 - Westdale Secondary School
- Students apply to the IB Programme in the designated IB catchment boundary in January of their grade 10 year
- Diploma Programme offered only in grades 11 and 12

<u>University recognition: How well is the diploma</u> <u>recognized by universities?</u>

The IB diploma is widely recognized by the world's leading universities.

Comparisons of IB students to OSSD and French Immersion graduates going to U of T and UBC

- A recent study (June 2022) found that DP students tend to perform better with higher grades
- DP students were less likely to drop out and more likely to graduate in a timely manner
- DP students were more likely to enrol in STEM programmes rather than Arts or other choices
- DP students earned more merit awards and were more likely to enrol in Co-Op programmes

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<u>United States Universities/Colleges</u>

- Students usually apply with the Common Application a central hub of collected references and letters for Universities to access when students apply to American post-secondary institutions.

- Around 900 Colleges use this system.
- The <u>Common Application</u> also notifies you of upcoming deadlines.
- Some Universities/Colleges (~140 schools) use **The Coalition**, which is a similar site: **www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org**

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Who is it for and what are the benefits?

- Two Diplomas! OSSD and IB
- University Preparation Program
 - Ongoing studies are being published on the success rates of IB Students once they enter University
- Internationally Written Curriculum
 - Students receive a curriculum that connects them to a Global Education
- Transferable to Many Countries and University Acceptance
 - Internationally recognized and widely thought of as a quality controlled and dynamic curriculum (not just for students who plan to go Out of Province for University)
- Transfer Credit
 - Students can apply for University credit based on their results.
- Scholarships
 - Many Universities offer IB Scholarship money based on IB Final grades.



Contents: What does the Diploma Programme curriculum contain?

The curriculum contains SIX subject groups and a core of three parts.



Students study over two years:

- three subjects at higher level (3 semesters/240 hours).
- three subjects at standard level
 (2 semesters/150 hours).
- all three parts of the core.

The IB Learner Profile and The Core are central to the philosophy of the Diploma Programme.

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<u>Contents: What does the Diploma Programme</u> curriculum contain?

The curriculum contains SIX subject groups and a core of three parts.



Group 1: English Language and Literature

Group 2: Language Acquisition: French or Spanish

Group 3: Individuals and Societies: Geography (Westdale) or History (Ancaster)

Group 4: Experimental Science – One of Biology or Chemistry

Group 5: Mathematics – Analysis and Approaches

Group 6: Arts – Visual Art or 2nd
Science

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The Core: Non-Classroom Components of the Diploma

All three components must be completed by students to earn the Diploma and students can earn up to 3 Bonus Points towards their Diploma.

<u>Theory of Knowledge</u> – TOK students DO get an OSSD credit for this component (HZT4U1)

Extended Essay – EE - University prep with a 4000 word essay.

<u>Creativity, Activity and Service</u> – CAS Project with 7 Learning Outcomes.

What is special about IB assessment?

IB assessment is rigorous, criterion related, consistent and differentiating of student ability.

- Diploma Programme assessment includes both final examinations and an internal assessment undertaken by the teacher using IB criteria and then externally moderated by the IB
- Marks awarded for each course range from 1 (lowest) to 7 (highest)
- The maximum diploma score is 45 points including the 3 bonus points
- Diploma is awarded to students who gain at least 24 points, complete the Core and get at least 12 points in their 3 HL courses (all must be 3 points or higher)

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What is special about IB assessment?

IB assessment is rigorous, criterion related, consistent and differentiating of student ability.

Grade Level Descriptors developed for each subject

In General:

- 7 Excellent performance
- 6 Very good performance
- 5 Good performance
- 4 Satisfactory performance
- 3 Mediocre performance
- 2 Poor performance
- 1 Very poor performance

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<u>IB Diploma</u>

- How can I get my IB Diploma in Grade 12?
 - 7 point marking scale
 - Pass each course (no marks of 1), 12 points in 3 HL courses
 - Receive a minimum of 24 Diploma Points
 - Complete the TOK and Extended Essay (pass both)
 - Complete CAS

Cost of the Program

- Reasons for Program Fees
 - IB Schools, once authorized from IB, pay yearly fees to the IBO to be able to deliver their curriculum
 - Examinations Fees for registering students in IBIS (IBO computer system) and to sit for examinations
 - Courier Fees- All examinations must be sent for marking and moderation
 - Teacher Training all IB teachers need to be trained (every 7 years) in an intensive 4 day workshop, locations all over North America.
 - IB resources: textbooks, study guides, lab materials





Program Fee Structure 2023 - 2024

Fees have been calculated on a cost recovery basis

Semester Program Fees:

\$550.00 payable each semester in Grades 11 and 12 (total of 4 semesters) (Note: USD may cause changes in this fee)

Total for complete programme: \$2,200.00

Families with financial needs may apply for support

Fees are paid by cheque or through School Cash Online





Timeline for Applications

- Applications open Dec 8 at 9:00 pm
- Completed Applications due to school by <u>January 13th</u>, <u>2023</u>
- Acceptance to the program communicated by individual school process near <u>February 4, 2023</u> and option sheets sent home.
- Option sheets due by February 25, 2023
- Invitation sent to register in Managebac. Each school will have their own timelines as to how/when this registration will take place. (just before school starts, for example.)





The Application Package

- The following documents are required for submission by the application deadline:
 - Application package including demographic information, student response questions and parent response questions
 - Status Sheet if not currently a Westdale or Ancaster student
 - Students coming from other provinces or countries need to be assessed by the Board at the Welcome Centre for prerequisite courses to give Prior Learning Equivalent Credits

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Cohort 2022 IB Graduate

Hello, My name is Ayush Patel. I am currently a first year student at McMaster in the iBio program (Biomedical Engineering). I went to Cardinal Newman before I switched to Westdale to do IB. Switching schools wasn't too bad for me. The IB cohort takes most of their classes together. So, you do spend a lot of time with the students in your cohort and get to know each other really well.

I decided to change schools to do IB because I felt that it was a great program for me. I wanted to do IB because I thought that the extra workload and the harder syllabus in the IB HL courses would be a good challenge for me. Additionally, I really liked that IB prepares you for university by making you go through a similar level of workload as you would expect in university and develop great time management skills and great study habits.

And now that I am in first year, I can say for certain that IB has prepared me well. I have been able to manage my workload using the skills I picked up during IB. Also, IB's harder syllabus means many of the things I am learning now in Chem and Math are review for me. In university, we also have to write many 10-15 page lab and project reports. Many of my classmates are not used to that that and have difficulties, but I did it many times in IB with my IA's and extended essay, so it is much easier for me. Overall, IB's rigorous workload and university level syllabus will prepare you well for first year university.
