The first session was held earlier this month at Waterdown District High School. The next session is on January 17, 2023 starting at 6:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. at A.M. Cunningham Elementary School.

We will reach out to surrounding communities/school council members directly, but anyone is welcome to attend any of the sessions available from now until May.

The format is casual, and we will have a brief agenda to guide our time. Items to share and discuss are School Council Support, Communication Standards, and general Board inquiries from you.

Our main priority is to offer these sessions to connect with a variety of parents, guardians, and caregivers who are volunteering their time to support the work and leadership of School Council. There is no RSVP required.

Topics discussed at the session at Waterdown High School included:

- Bylaws/Constitution best practices
- Fundraising ideas and successes
- Engaging events and how to attract volunteers
- Communication with families and between School Council Chair/School Principal
- Advocacy (School Council can advocate through Principal and to the Parent Involvement Committee; the Parent Involvement Committee can advocate to the Board of Trustees)

Sharing the knowledge: Parent Reaching Out Grant (Pro Grant)

The Parents Reaching Out Grants (Pro Grant) program provides funding to school boards to provide opportunities for School Councils, the Parent Involvement Committee (PIC) and the school community to lead projects that support parent/guardian/caregiver engagement and align with at least one of the following objectives:

- Addressing social inclusion and racism specifically anti-Asian, anti-Black, and anti-Indigenous racism and other prejudices toward racialized and marginalized groups
- Creating a safe and welcoming environment
- Demonstrating respect for parents as valued partners within the education system regarding decisions about their child's education
- Enhancing communication with teachers
- Informing parents about the expectations of the Ontario Curriculum and supporting resources.

Applications that meet the criteria are eligible for a maximum amount of \$1,000. Schools may develop applications individually, or with another school. If schools choose to collaborate on an event, they can submit one application and combine funding. Individuals from the school

community who have ideas for projects or initiatives that they would like considered, are encouraged to connect with their School Council or Principal.

Project Guidelines and Activities

- o Activities must follow all Public Health measures and HWDSB procedures. Should conditions change and revisions to applications be requested, please contact PIC@hwdsb.on.ca
- o Activities will support School Council initiatives or initiatives in partnership with community organizations
- o Activities will identify and address local barriers to parent engagement and may include but are not limited to:
- Development of parent resources (e.g. leadership resource for parents, resources addressing well-being, mental health, and anti-racism for students and families, etc.)

Please see the included application package for information regarding the PRO Grant application process for the 2022-2023 school year.

Information should be shared with School Councils as soon as possible to encourage discussion and consideration for projects related to supporting parent/guardian/caregiver engagement.

The maximum funding per school is \$1000 and the due date for applications is January 27th, 2023. The application must have the signature of both the School Council Chair and the Principal.

Timelines

- Delivery of parent information sessions (e.g. how to support children and families at home, how to understand curriculum, etc.)
- Delivery of parent engagement sessions (e.g. parent networking sessions)
- Innovative activities that enable enhanced and diversified parent engagement.
- November January: School Councils provide input to the Principal regarding the focus and scope of the activities
- January 27, 2023 PRO Grant applications due, please send completed applications to
 PIC@hwdsb.on.ca
- o February 24, 2023 follow up communication with schools
- o June 30, 2023 projects must be completed and funding spent

Additional Considerations

As a reminder, ineligible expenses include:

- o Activities that took place prior to September 6th, 2022
- o Activities that focus on students
- o Payment to school board staff or volunteers including salaries, honoraria, gifts
- o Refreshments exceeding 10% of the approved funding
- o Out-of-province travel
- o Debts or financial losses that result from a project
- o Fundraising events
- o Central administration expenses must not exceed 10% of the budget (Examples: office supplies; copying and printing; postage; telephone costs; internet and wireless communication, dues, fees and licenses; legal, accounting or audit fees; insurance; bank charges and interest)

You will find an application form for the Parent Reaching Out Grant on the next page.

Planning should be a collaboration between school councils and the school principal.

Take your time completing it accurately and be sure to fill in all sections
