

Purpose of tonight's meeting

- Address the short-term accommodation pressures of east Waterdown:
 - Better balance enrolments between Flamborough Centre and Mary Hopkins
 - Limited ability to place additional portables at Mary Hopkins
- Receive feedback from community

Projected Timelines



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Background – How did we get here?

- Ongoing residential development South of Hwy 5
- 2017-2018 Mary Hopkins (MH) introduces French Immersion (FI) commencing with grade 1 FI
- 2022-2023 Flamborough Centre receives FI grade 6s from Mary Hopkins
- Land purchased for new school in 2021
- 2021-2022, 2022-2023, and 2023 (October) applied to the Ministry to fund the new school South of Hwy 5



Potential Timelines for Southeast Waterdown School

- Capital priorities submission October 2023
- Anticipate capital priority approval 1st quarter 2024
- Anticipated completion of construction and occupancy of new school by September 2027


This makes this accommodation strategy an anticipated three-year solution.



Proposed Strategy and Implementation

- Commencing September 2024 all <u>new registrations</u> in the English Program JK-5 Mary Hopkins boundary that live south of Highway 5 are directed to Flamborough Centre.
- New JK registrations in the identified area with siblings in Mary Hopkins may request an exemption to attend Mary Hopkins.
- Process to request move of JK-5 students to Flamborough Centre is an out of catchment request and will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.



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Revised Review Schedule - Implications

- 2024-2025 Staffing allocation obligations will have been assigned in late February
- Mary Hopkins is estimated to require a minimum of 3 portables
 - For a total of 13 portables

Additional Facility Information



Flamborough Centre Facility

HWDSB is working with third parties to ensure that the infrastructure is appropriate for the population expected at FC.

Septic

- Engaged an engineer to assess the existing infrastructure and to guide us in an appropriate course of action related to existing conditions and to address any deficiencies
- Initiated conversation with Waterloo Biofilter to determine the most appropriate short and longterm solutions for the septic system. This includes a plan to replace the entire system with new

Well Water

- A review of the conditions related to the well water has occurred and the filter change process has since been increased
- Well water testing is completed every day in accordance with the MECP regulations to ensure safe use and consumption

Parking

Number of spaces is part of the Building Permit process to place additional portables

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Mary Hopkins – Facility

- There are 10 portables on site currently
- Maximum number is 12 based on Building Permit requirements (parking, washrooms). Other considerations include electrical capacity, fire route, etc.)
- Washroom renovations to add 3 fixtures to the existing spaces are planned and will begin over the Winter Break with work continuing during March Break



Transportation – Impacts

- HWSTS prioritizes student safety and adheres to guiding principles in planning bus routes
- Annually, bus routes are determined according to the transportation needs of all eligible riders
- After reviewing the current ridership at Flamborough Centre, it has been determined that there is capacity on some of the existing buses for additional students
- The bus loop at Flamborough Centre has space for at least one additional bus
